My waite may not carry on to Ved., so I decided to write to you instead, and give these suggestions. The convoice have to know at once that they are gotting two latters of the week .. the regular one from Hike as national coorganiser and the gratici one , which had the origins all the vey back last swemer, when we received a letter from the Black Domestic Vorkers Union in South Africe, sating if we could sponger one of their organizers for a national tour of the U.S., to present their in-person story to the second America. We twok this to the RES, which immediately responded that we wented to support such a tour, even though we could not offer any money for it ourselves. We undertook to raise the money through universities and unions to bring him here, not because we thought that he was a M-Hist, or had illusions, but because the principle of international solidarity, or dialogue with those involved in an ongoing revolution, is so important to us. Mkx Not only that, but the celetionship with our friends in South Africa has put us on the map in Soweto -- and now we have South African revolutioneries who are reading and discussing Whist ideas for the first time. Lou, you will write this latter.

Low will describe all the many organizations that helped raise the money and participated in the tour. Mention to how many meetings we were invited as Mists and set up lit tables, spoke our ideas— to other organizations who appreciated that we brought a non-Mist South African revolutionary, who had spent 5 years in Robbens Island, and was organizar of the Domestic workers, and who joined ik with others in displaying a banner that said: "We are supporting NGL in Soweto"— precisely because we had this tour.

It is no accident whatever that this is the period -- the 28th year since 1959; when the famous international conference on Negritude was held in Rome, and from which we quote the famous Fanon speech, crtiquing the new Black leader-ship-- when a new international conference is taking wake place, and right here in the U.S., in Miami, on this same subject (see NYT, 3/1/87, p.19). It was attended by 500 man and women from who came to hear 60 Black ethnologists, academicians, writers and artists-- including Carlos Moore, a Black Cuban exile who is prof. of anthrology, and a Black woman from Peru. What may seem unrelated is example; actually part of this great re-swakening of both deep philosophic discussions and actual movements that can be called completely revolutionary, which are happening simultaneously. And we have relations with both arenas. We are accepted precisely because, though we are very openly Milate, we do not try to take over other movements, but work with them on specific class and women's and race actions.

Be sure to tell them that you are on your way to Alabama.
