From Karl Marx's Contribution to the Chitique of Higel's Philosophy of Right, 1844 (

"The basis of irreligious criticism is this: man makes religion; religion does not take man.... But man is not an abstract being, squatting outside the world. Hen is the human world, the state, society... Religion is the general theory of this world, its employedic compendium, its legic in popular form, its spiritual point dibonneur, its enthusiasm, its meral sanction, its science complement, its general basis of consolation, and justification. It is the fartastic realization of the human being insamuch as the human being possesses no true reality."

"Religion is the wigh of the oppressed creature, the sentiment of a hearless world, and the soul of soulless conditions... he abolition of religion as the illusory happiness of men is a demand for their real happiness. The call to abandon their illusions about their condition is a call to abandon a condition which requires illusions. The criticism of religion is, therefore, the embryonic criticism of this vale of tears of which religion is the balo.....

"It is the tack of history, therefore, once the other-world of truth has vanished, to establish the truth of this world. The immediate task of philosophy, which is in the service of history, is to unmask human self-alienation in its secular form now that it has been unmasked in its secret form. Thus the criticism of heaven is transformed into the criticism of earth, the criticism of religion into the criticism of law, and the criticism of theology into the criticism of politics."

Majorial force can only be everthrown by material force but theory itself become a material force when it has solved the masses. Theory is capable of selving the masses when it demonstrates ad hominem, and it demonstrates ad hominem as soon as it become rational. To be radical it to grasp things by the root. But, for man the root is man himself."

"Theory is only reslized in a people so far as it fulfils the needs of the people. "Will theoretical needs be directly reaction needs? It is not amough that thought should seek to realize itself; reality must also strive towards thought."

From ALLEGATED LABOR

"We shall begin from a contemporary economic fact. The worker becomes poorer the more wealth he produces and the more his production increases in power and extent. The worker becomes an ever cheaper commodity the more goods he create. The devaluation of the human world increases in direct relation with the increase in value of the world of things. Labor does not only create goods; it also produces itself and the worker as a commodity......This fact simply implies that the object produced by labour, its product, now stands opposed to it as an alien being as a power independent of the producer...."

"Political economy begins with labour as the real soul of production and then goes on to attribute nothing to labor and everything to private property. From the relation of allemated incour to private property it also follows that the emancipation of society from private property, from servitude, take the political form of the emancipation of the workers."
