Dear Harry:

By now you have the speech and part of the discussion at our convention, and so can see some of the problems that bother us. I have also decided to include you along with the REB into some letters dealing with the philosophical problems of new book. I'm hoping you can help by commenting on them, what, if anything, they mean to you; and whether the empiric English can be forced to break their heads on the dialectic. (If only we had money I sure would like to take out the 3 chapters on CAPITAL, including the introductory to them on the historic situation of the Civil War and the Paris Commune, publish them as a separate pamphlet and "force" all youth to study CAPITAL not merely as "economics" but as philosophy and history and the philosophy of history which is so essential to our age.)

Do let me hear from you on the enclosed addressed to Bess and Eugene. Also, has Foot commented to you on receiving letter from me. Incidentally, do you send the Japanese a copy of The Marxist-Humanist; if not, please begin now, especially including that wonderful leaflet you distributed on M&F; it will help them in their work on it. I'm sure indeed that Com. Yukiwama would like to hear directly from you since they are now confronted suddenly with Trotskyism trying to take over leadership of "anti-Stalinist ~~Summa~~ Left". (And even Khrushchev could fit there, couldn't he, as the most famous "deStalinizer".) /
