The specific 1882 Preface to the Russian edition of the Manifesto Which was written when Marx had completed two years of his intensive studies . has special relevance to us here of all the new work in anthropology and to Luxunturg's prolomatic in the 1905 Russian Revolution and after. Now, it is precisely this question which had Executed preoccupied the Russian revolutionaries, including of course Luxemburg, and recommendational 1910 indeed; became the centerpiece of the/dispute with Kautsky on "Theory and Practice" and on the relationship Karamanof "backward" Russia and "advanced" Germany. Because, fundamentally, the failure of the 1905 revolution lay in the objective situation it was all too easy to attribute the entire failure just to that, to the backwardness of the country, to the might of the Tsarist empire, that hubub of reaction and counter-revolution at home and a abroad. Luxemburg balked, however, at trying to make that sound as if the Russian proletarist was backward.
