Raya Dunayevskaya, political analyst and philosopher, is the author of *Marxism and Freedom . . . From 1776 Until Today*; *Nationalism, Communism, Marxist-Humanism and the Afro-Asian Revolutions*; *Philosophy and Revolution, from Hegel to Sartre and from Marx to Mao* (now being translated into Italian and Spanish); *Notes on Women's Liberation: Women as Reason and Revolutionary Force*. She has also published in *Presence Africaine*, *China Monthly*, *The American Review*, and *Erich Fromm's international symposium, Socialist Humanism*. A one-time secretary to the famous Leon Trotsky, she broke with him because of her insistence that Russia was not a workers' state. She has lectured at many universities — California, Columbia, Chicago, Wisconsin, Edinburgh, Cambridge, Leeds, Tokyo, Kyoto, among others— on such topics as Marxist Humanism, Africa, the Black Revolt in America, and the Challenge of Mao Tse-tung. Recently she lectured at the Hegel Society of America Conference.
