Racists in Uproar As School Bells Ring

AS THE BELLS ring for the first day of school this fall, the integration-desegregation process is proceeding slowly. On the other hand, the schools question has become the center of increased political and legal activity intended to prevent integra-

tion from being accomplished at any time soon, if ever, in a namber of the Southern states. The segregationists are on the offensive.

Numerous school lawsuits are before the courts covering every phase from actual desegration to school band issues. Surveys indicate that there have been 95 lawsuits arising out of the Supremo Court decision on segregation in schols since May 1954. They inalude every state except Vississip-
