nist Party was seen as a further
step in this Polish process. Gomulka had been criticized as a "Titoite", and served several years in
prison on trumped up charges. The
Polish government and party have
completely cleared him of any
criminal charges and denounced
his imprisonment as a miscarriage
of justice. In contrast with Hungary, Bulgaria and Czechoslovakia
the Poles had not executed any of
those framed on such charges.

A significant conclusion from all the discussion and debate going on in the socialist countries is that the stress on diverse paths to socialism and expression of varying viewpoints has not divided the socialist countries but brought them together even more closely. Now this close connection is based more primutual trust and selidarity, ther than on authority.
