

# CANADIAN RED AIDE RESTORED BY PARTY

TORONTO, July 18—J. B. Salsberg has been re-elected to the executive committee of the Labor-Progressive [Communist] party in Canada.

The former member of the Ontario Legislature, at odds with the party over the treatment of Jews in the Soviet Union since 1949, was removed from the party's secretariat in 1953 and from the national executive in 1954.

In a 1,500-word statement the party confessed that Mr. Sals-

berg was right and the majority of the national executive wrong.

The statement reads in part:

“Viewed in light of recent events and on the basis of facts now available it is clear that in the original difference as to whether the dissolution of Jewish cultural institutions in the U. S. S. R. resulted from the integration of its Jewish citizens in the general cultural community and whether the Labor-Progressive party should or should not have asked for the reasons for such dissolution and the subsequent action against prominent Jewish writers, J. B. Salsberg was right and the majority of the national executive wrong.”
