LONDON, Tuesday, July 3 (AP)
— Britain's Communist Daily Worker took a reserved attitude today on the Soviet party declaration.

It printed much of the declaration and said in an editorial:

“We Communists and our friends in the wider labor movement have had most heart-searching discussions and arguments both as to the manner of launching and the significance of the [downgrading of Stalin]. Especially have we all been concerned to draw the correct lessons for our own movement and for our own country. This we shall continue to do.”
