

COMMUNIST UNITS MOVE

State and National Quarters Shifted to 23 W. 26th St.

The Communist party has moved into a new home at 23 West Twenty-sixth Street. A party spokesman said yesterday that it had taken a lease with options for five years on the three-story building to shelter its national and state organizations.

The Communists had previously been tenants of a building at 101 West Sixteenth Street, along with the recently closed Jefferson School for Social Science, but that building has been sold to new owners. The party's national convention in February voted to move national headquarters to Chicago within a year.
