
RED PAPER FACES CRISIS

Weekly Worker Cuts Staff, Puts Off Printing Bill

The Worker, weekly Communist party organ here, is in severe financial difficulties, the issue published yesterday reported.

The Worker's management was at first uncertain that yesterday's issue would appear and then thought of publishing four pages instead of the usual sixteen. A twenty-four-hour postponement of the printing bill and financial help from some New York supporters finally helped to overcome the immediate crisis.

The Worker's staff has been reduced to five persons to cut costs, it was announced. To meet the financial emergency, the paper said, priority in the allocation of funds received by the Communist party up to Monday will be given to The Worker. The party is now engaged in a drive to raise \$185,000.
