REDS EXPLAIN ACTION

Loman Suspension Not Linked to Finances, Party Says

The New York State Communist party asserted yesterday that the suspension of Charles Loman, former party chairman for Kings County, from all his state party posts, had nothing to do with finances.

The party repeated a previous explanation that he had been suspended because he had "taken an extended trip, leaving his positions of responsibility without discharging his official bligations."

The suspended official is reported to have gone abroad last month. Yesterday's statement for the state party regarding his suspension was issued by Benjamin J. Davis, chairman, and William Albertson, executive secretary.
