Ninety-nine percent of all the ,people in the United States of all the people everywhere, are against war, are against the present capitalist war. But these 99% are not united on a clear-cut program of action. The one percent of the population - the large financiers and capitalists - are therefore easily able to divide the 99% and lead the nations into a war for murder and plunder, profits and markets.

Mr. Morgan and Mr. Rockefeller know just what they want and they know how to get it! Through their puppet in the white-house, Franklin Roosevelt, they're preparing for war day and night.

There's only one thing that starts wars - not honor, or peace, or self-determination, or the worship of god, but just the simple and vicious struggle between the capitalist nations over markets, colonies and spheres of influence.

And there's only one thing that can stop war - the revolution of the working class of all nations against capitalism.

Any other plan, any other strategy is only grist to the mill of the capitalist war plans, is only another means of dividing up the 99% who HATE war.

PACIFISM AIDS WAR MONGERS

You can't fight war by passing pacifist resolutions against war. All the resolutions in the world aren't worth a damn when the conscription officer comes around with a bayonet to pull you into the army.

You can't fight war by passing Ludlow Amendments, such as the Trotskyites propose, giving the people the "rright" to vote on war. Our Congress and Executive is controlled, lock, stock and barrell, by big business, by the war makers. Even if you could pass such an amendment it wouldn't be upheld. In the last World War Wilson was elected on a program of keeping America out of war. But 5 months late be declared war.

Why - because the big capitalists controlled Congress, all the ambassadors, all the judges, and the President himself.

The same big capitalists — you can name them on the finger of one hand — still control (and always will control under capitalism) members of Congress and Mr. Roosevelt or any other capitalist President. Ambassador Kennedy is a banker tied up with Morgan interests. Ambassador Biddle is part of a Morgan partner's family. Ambassador Bullit is another former bank executive. All of the members of the war resources board are big capitalists — a Morgan partner heads the board and NATIONAL NEWS. Enclosed is \$1.00. members include the president of the biggest trust in America, the American Telephone and Telegraph Co., a direction of General Motors, the head of Sears Roebuck and others. Henry Morgenthau, of the treasury department, is the son of a wealthy banker. Three new Morgenthau aids are big bankers. President Roosevelt, no poor man himself, served in the cabinet of President Wilson - a cabinet which was controlled from top to bottom by big money. President Roosevelt was the big shot in the presidential campaign of Al Smith only 11 years ago, a campaign organized and run by the DuPont munition interests.

FOR THE CLASS STRUGGLE

These capitalists are not "Peace" lovers. They believe in the class struggle, from THE CAPITALIST point of view. They constantly attempt to break up strikes, unions, and other labor organizations by the use of FORCE, with thugs and police thugs.

There is only one answer to these people, both in "peace" time and in war time — THE CLASS STRUGGLE, from a working class point of view the fight for workers rights, better wages, real security, etc.

We are for working for the defeat of our "own" capitalist class in war even if this means the momentary victory of the 'enemy" capitalist.

BUILD THE NEW PARTY

Yes, there is only one way to stop war. No illusions of pacifism. No illusions about capitalist "democracy", which is fast showing its other side, its open dictatorship and suppression. No illusions in "Ludlow Amendments." No abstract words about "we are for socialism."

The only way to stop war is by a clear PROGRAM OF ACTION THAT WILL LEAD THE WORKING CLASS TOWARDS THE OVERTHROW OF CAPITALISM ON A WORLD SCALE SOCIETY. That program is the continuation of the class struggle reduction in the pay of WPA AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A WORLD WORKERS in war time — revolutionary defeatism.

And the only way to give guidance to this struggle is to organize anew a World Party of the Working Class, a New Communist (4th) International, just as Lenin and the Bolsheviks did during and after the last world war, just as the International Contact Commission is trying to do today.

TRADE UNION NOTES

According to acting WPA Commi sioner Hunter WPA rolls have been cut from 3,346,107 in October of last year to less than 1,800,000 today. Mr. Hunter also admits that the pay raises of 35 million dollars in the south are workers in the North.

What's going to happen to these one and a half million work-ers laid off? All the talk about new jobs as a result of the war boom are greatly exaggerated. Ferdinand Lunoberg in his book "America" — 60 families shows how the capitalist press always exaggerates the hiring of a few thousand workingmen during the depression, and always fails to report big lay-offs. The same is true of the present "war boom". Only a few thousand workers are getting new jobs; the great majority of the 16 million unemployed will never get work a-- except in Uncle Sam's gain army and navy, where they can be used as cannon fodder.

The CIO burocrats, however, are using the same old policy. In order to push the Martin AFL union out of business they were forced to call strikes in a number of places. But each time they limit the strike to only one section of the industry, even though the auto industry is so integrated that for every one man striking there are usually ten locked out. As a result of this policy the CIO usually gets recognition as a bargaining agency, but the men fail to get their economic demands.

The auto workers must fight within their union for an end to this "divide" policy. "Spread the strike" must be the key slogan of every strike in this, as well as other, industries.

The capitalists of all nations want to win the war so they can save their system, so they make bigger profits and gain new markets and colonies.

We the working class must work for the defeat — military defeat - of our "own" capitalist class. They ask us to shoot the "enemy". We refuse to shoot our fellow workers across the trenches. They ask us to work longer hours at low wage rates. while prices go up sky-high. They ask us not to strike in the interests of "national unity". We refuse to submit to this swindle. There is no "national unity", now or never. These are just two classes in society — the capitalist class who live off the fruits of our labor, and the working class who produce everything. In war time and in peace time we must continue the fight for higher wages, better working conditions. We must fight for WORKERS CONTROL OF PRODUCTION for use.

They ask us to be "patriotic." For them patriotism means jobs on the war resources board, sale of 38 billion dollars of war supplies, profits that run into billions. For us "patriotism" means longer hours, death on the battlefields, a lower standard of living.

Sailors assigned to ships that are headed for the war zone in Europe are demanding a \$250 bonus, a 40% wage increase, and a \$25,000 insurance policy for each man. As we go to press the U. S. Maritime Commission and the shipowners have failed to act on these demands.

The shipowners insurance rates have jumped as high as 1500% since the war broke out. On most items the rates have tripled. On gold the rates are 41/2 times as high as a few weeks ago. But the shipowners want the men who operate the ships to take the same pay and work under the same conditions.

In the face of the war crisis and the super-profits the shipowners are about to make the sailors should prepare not only to strike for these demands but should absolutely refuse to ship any materials to any warring

between Hitler, It a ly, and Japan, although aimed at the Soviet Union and the working class, was primarily used against the western "democracies," especially Great Britain. It was an attempt to blackmail Britain into giving concessions. The capitulation of Stalin to Hitler does not change the double purpose of the pact. On the contrary the Pact has served its purpose well.

As to Japan and Spain repudiating the "pact" because of the Stalin-Hitler relationship, one can say that this is an excuse and not a cause. Japan's national interest, (despite the desires of the young generals who have just been removed from the saddle) lay not in a military alliance with Germany, but in "neutrality" such as that of the United States — in other words a free hand in Asia while the other powers fight in Europe. And if this were not possible then in siding with the Anglo-French. The open declaration of war brought the internal struggle in Japan to a head, and the group that advocated this policy all along won. (See FIGHTING WORKER, Sept. 1, 1939).

As for Spain, her position over Italy. was unternable at the very start. If she had joined Hitler her fate would have been sealed even sooner than Polands. Devastated by the Civil War. with over a hundred thousand trained Loyalist Spanish troops in Southern France; cut off from supplies and aid from Germany and Italy; she would be "neutral" position is the life role that Mussolini has cut out

gaining the upper hand, the German or British, the fact remains that so far Italian neutrality has OBJECTIVELY aided the Germans. Not only were the Anglo-French forced to change their whole military plan of attack, but Italian ships ply the seas and bring in all war supplies, which in turn are

shipped to Germany. Today, unlike the first world war, Germany has two lifebelts of supplies. She has the Russia bread basket at her disposal and as long as Italy is neutral she has direct connections, without fear of the British blockade, to the entire world.

Turkeys' position is also very important. Russia, Germany and England are busy working for final action in Turkey. Her key position in near-east can alter important relations depending upon her position of the United States. final action. One thing can be said now. Whereas Italian neutrality or military support of Germany both aid Germany: Turkish neutrality aids England at present, because of the unknown quantity in Italy. A declaration of war now by Turkey may be decisive to force Italy into the struggle with Germany. England has not given up hope of winning

THE MOST IMPORTANT UNKNOWN QUANTITY
