such criterions as "whose army marched first", or "who is using force." The Red Army, is not an ornament. It was built to help extend the October Revolution and to defend to stave off the blow. It capitulates to Hitler today, just what has already been gained.

In 1919 the Red Army tried unsuccessfully to crash through Rumania in order to help the shortlived Workers State in Hungary. In 1920 the Red Army marched into Poland to help extend the revolution there. A few years later the Red Army aided in taking back the Chinese Eastern Railway for the Russian workers.

The difference between a Red Army and a bourgeois army is not that one marches and the other doesn't. The difference is that the capitalist armies march because their economy is breaking down, because they must have new markets and new spheres of influence or else they crumble; while the Red Army marches in order to extend the area of Workers Rule.

The German army today is marching because German economy is bankrupt. The British army marches to defend its plunders and robberies of the last war. But the Workers State does not need any plunder. Its economy, far from breaking down (as is the case everywhere else in the world) is making progress DESPITE STALINISM.

PLANNED ECONOMY MAKES PROGRESS

Here are a few figures that will throw some light on the question.

According to the League of Nations, U. S. production decreased by 12% from 1929 to 1936; German production increased by 6% in this period; British production by 16%; Japanese production, because of the war in China, increased by 51%; BUT SOVIET PRODUCTION IN-CREASED BY 282%. American capitalism retired one factory after another in this period, but Soviet Economy added 88 billion rubles of capital, of new factories and plants.

Soviet economy is not capitalist economy; it has different property relations which remain in spite of Stalinism. Planned production, once the capitalists are expropriated, is infinitely superior to the anarchistic production of capitalism in the U.S., Germany, or anywhere else. Stalinism, therefore, makes a last desperate attempt as it capitulated to France yesterday. In return for a short respite, it aids the Fascist war plans, it helps the overrunning of Poland; it gives up every semblance of agitation against both war and Fascism.

Shall we fight, then for the defeat of the Red Army, just as we work for the defeat of all capitalist armies on both sides of the war front? No, the Soviet Union and Stalinism are not one and the same, any more than a burocratic trade union leadership is the same as the union itself.

As revolutionists we must continue to defend the property relations in the Soviet Union at the same time that we fight Stalinism. We must work not to destroy the Red Army but to strengthen it; to eliminate the Stalinist leadership and to reestablish Workers Democracy.

The new territory in Soviet hands is quite a problem. If Stalin attempts to widely expropriate the capitalists of the territory taken over, he comes into conflict with his Fascist ally and the capitalist elements within Russia. If he does not establish socialist property relations the new territory will be used as a base to re-establish capitalism throughout the Soviet Union. Either way, the new territory will increase the internal antagonisms in the Soviets.

Shall the workers and peasants in Poland attempt to oust the Soviet rule? We think that would be wrong. Just like the workers in the rest of the Soviet Union they must work now for a political revolution against Stalinism to re-establish Workers Democracy, to oust Stalinism, and to extend the revolution to the rest of Central and Western Europe.

THE ROOSEVELT POLICY

Roosevelt rode into power on the forces that represent the present law, the light inductries and those that supply the consumer. But conditions have changed and Roosevelt with them. A national emergency, either from the proletarian revolution or from the imperialist war, demands of the executive committee of the capitalists greater unity AGAINST the common enemy-in this case, the war. At the same time the profits are more plentiful and there is room in the trough for all the pigs. The less profits the more friction within the nation among the exploiters.

The national needs of the capitalist class as a whole and the greater profits have brought about a temporary "national" understanding of the Roosevelt - Rockefeller crowd and the Morgan-Landon crowd. It has brought together old-line Democrats and New Deal Democrats. But those sections of both parties that represent the finan. ciers of light industry, consumers goods, etc. that is, those that will not profit directly by sale of war material, have united to fight the Roosevelt-Landon bloc.
