THE **NEGRO** WORKER

The character of British class rule and the type of democracy that the ruling class is willing to sacrifice hundreds of thousands of black, brown, and white workers for, can best be seen in the African colonies and the Union of South Africa. After Britain had gained most of her colonies in the same manner that Hitler has taken central Europe, the British capitalists proceeded in the same vicious and brutal way of exploiting the African masses for which today they are condemning Germany.

The Union of South Africa has a population of nine and a half million peopl.e. Two million are white, six and a half million Negroes, one quarter of a million Indians and three quarters of a million coloured. (a mixture of white and Negro) To insure the class rule of the white boss over these workers the Government developed has a race theory similar to that of Nazi Germany. White superiority is preached to divide the 300,000 white workers from the Negro and Indian work-The economic, social and ers. educational circumstances of these whites are the same as the poor whites in the south. To further the division of the workers, certain minor social privileges are given to the coloured workers. This is the old British ruling class game of divide and rule that has prevented a joint struggle of the workers and peasants against their common oppressor.

THE BURDEN OF PROFITS

During all the years of British occupation of South Africa little has been done to benefit the masses of people. The only visible burden that the white man has been carrying is the money that has been shipped to England in the form of profits sweated out of the hide of the natives. Threefourths of the total population is illiterate. It is the general opinion of the rulers that education turns a good native into a bad European.

Mr. Malcolm Macdonald, minister of colonies said several weeks ago to a group of students at Oxford that too much democracy would spoil the natives. Realizing later that this was not enough to justify the vicious British rule in Africa he pointed out the existence of car certain \cdot tribes. cannibalism among This is highly questionable. But there is a form of cannibalism in Afrca that is much worse than the form that Mr. Mcdonald has in mind, \mathbf{the} cannibalism of British Imperialism is much more gruesome and destructve of human life than the primitive cannibalism of the tribes.

In spite of British oppression the rumble of revolt can be heard. Not long ago a group of Trade Unions and anti-imperialist leagues issued a manifesto that said in part: that the African people who are to fight for the many and that they refuse to fight in a war only to defend their own oppression and lack of rights. The idea of defending Democracy is a fraud. There never has been democracy for the workers under the British government. We can expect a time when our own capitalist government will start talking about "defending democracy" (the profits of the ruling class). The Negro worker should remember Lynching and discrimination that is so much a part of American Democracy.

ism and its present ally, Germany. Russia gains access to an ice-free port in the Arctic; complete control of the Gulf of Finland and partial control of the Gulf of Bothnia through the Hango base, the islands near Viborg, and the Karelian Isthmus: and shorter and cheaper communication to Sweden, Norway and Germany through the new railroad that is to be built in Central Finland.

Stalinism, too, gains out of the peace compact. Its greatly damaged prestige will now be repaired to an extent and it can concentrate on:"1-bolstering its home economy and placating mass discontent in the U.S.S.R.; and 2-concentrating on defense against Japan in Asia.

The main victor, however, is Nazi Germany. It was Nazi pressure that made Stalinism retreat from its proclaimed task of conquering all of Finland, in return for these DEFENSIVE concessions; and it was Nazi pressure that forced Finland to come to terms.

Out of the victory Germany now will gain greater economic and political control over Scandinavia, as well as the Balkans. Already Dr. Schacht is on his way to Sweden to gain economic concessions. Undoubtedly great concessions will be wrung from the small powers throughout this area: Germany is becoming the undisputed master of central Europe and Scandinavia.

In addition Germany defeated a major military attempt of Britain and France to outflank the Siegfried line by making the new battlefront Scandinavia. This victory alone is the greatest victory of the peace.

4-Germany Uses Russia and Italy **Against Each Other**

On the basis of the great strength gained by Germany since its conquest of Austria — political victories, which unfortunately for Hitler must still be consolidated economically — Germany is able now to use Russia, Italy, and Japan against each other in order to wring concessions from all the members of its so-called allies.

As pressure for Italy to become a more open military ally of Germany and to submit to a division of the Balkans, Germany has used Stalinist threats in that area. After the present victory it is evident that Germany will soon get what she wanted. Russia is offering Rumania a "non-aggression" pact under German pressure and the papers are filled with "hints" that Italy may soon join with Russia and Germany to decide on shares in the Balkan loot.

fensive nature. Germany and United States both stopped the Soviet Union from gaining any important concessions of offensive nature (of attack): for instance the strategic nickel mines, the port of Petsamo itself, the Aaland Islands, etc.

Furthermore Stalinism binds itself more and more under the thumb of German Imperialism. Germany stopped the war to a great extent in order to increase Russian supplies going to the Reich. As a result of the peace new German technicians are being sent into Russia to help "re-organize" trade and transport, to help oil production, etc. We must point out still again that Stalin's ally — German Imperialism - is doing more to undermine the Workers State from within than other powers are doing from outside.

6—Finnish Workers bound to Revolt

After months of lying reports from the Finnish capitalists about "big victories" the Finnish workers face the stark reality of defeat, no homes, a reconstruction which will mean lower wages, etc. We believe that future news stories will confirm that major or minor revolts have been going on through out Finland in the last period and are bound to continue. The victory of the Red Army will accelerate these developments. No doubt the bourgeois banker Ryti and the Stalinist regime have agreed to jointly smash any attempts at revolution in Finland. 7-Peace Offensive Is Ready to Start Again

As a result of this victory Germany is again in position to press for a temporary peace in order to consolidate her political victories of the last few years. Since American Imperialism is also pushing for this objective (for her own reasons) a new "Peace Offensive" is very likely.

8-U. S. Role

Uncle Sam's role is not as complicated as most Americans think. The U.S. is anxious to:

a-Smash the Workers State in the Soviet Union and check the developments of Communism — which Roosevelt and the Pope understand clearly is the greatest danger. The present perspective therefore calls for liquidating the present war and creating an alliance of all world powers as a "crusade" against "Atheist" Russia disturbance. - with the Pope naturally giving his blessings; and

Academic freedom, pro and con, heads the fortnight's news. MR. WELLES - TRAIL BLAZER OF A HOPED-FOR U.S. EMPIRE

March 17 — As the Finnish-Soviet war is concluded, Sumner Welles continues to traipse about Europe's capitals. Behind the comments of the boss press about what a jolly nice chap he is and how many times he changes suits every day, very serious moves are being made by the puppet statesmen of the imperialist powers.

The more Welles emphasizes the "fact-finding" nature of his trip the more it is apparent that he is in Europe for better reasons than a state department reporter.

Welles is talking about: peace, trade and export of capital. He is seriously probing the possibility of patching up the war between Germany and the Anglo-French imperialist bandits out of fear of revolutionary developments and in order to drive them against the Soviet Union.

American imperialism has sent Welles to Europe to probe the possibilities of utilizing the divisions of the imperialists in Europe for U.S. ends against Great Britain. Germany can play a big role in this struggle. That is the reason Welles is dealing with both Rome and Berlin in great detail. For that reason the Allies are receiving Welles coldly for they are not willing to see German imperialism attain such a position, any more than they are willing to recognize that the U.S. will have dominance in the imperialist camp.

Hitler, who has gained in the Soviet-Finnish war, takes advantage of this opportunity to talk about "peace" and offers to lend a willing ear to Roosevelt's proposals This only serves to increase the hypocritical lies of the Anglo-French imperialists that they are fighting America's war to crush Hitlerism.

Putting the Finishing Touches on Labor's Straitjacket

Business and government are united today-in a vicious onslaught against the Unions and Unionism. In Sioux City and Minneapolis militant unions are being tried in court on all sorts of phoney charges. Throughout the nation Mr. Thurman Arnold's legal lights are busy attempting to smash the AFL Building Trades and other unions by trying them for that phoniest of all phoney charges: "Conspiracy".

In Chicago and elsewhere local police are beginning with the Revolt Comrades. to "supervise" Union elections, raid union headquarters. The Ku Klux Klan and other strike-breaking outfits have answered the new AFL, CIO and Sharecroppers organizing campaigns in the South by vicious terrorism against the union organizers, including such pleasant pastimes as flogging, lynching threats, etc. In San Francisco the Employers' Council is riding high, having smashed almost every strike it came in contact with in 1939, and being on the verge of getting Harry Bridges, Maritime leader to agree to prohibit future coast strikes.

1934-37 A PERIOD OF GAINS

It's time, in this crucial year of war and before the American capitalists clink down the chains of a full dictatorship, to take stock of what happened to the Labor Movement.

From 1934 to 1937 the working masses of America rose up in one militant strike after another and made some of the most significant gains in all history. The truck drivers strikes in Minneapolis; general strikes in San Francisco, Terra Haute, Pekin; the famous Toledo Chevrolet and Autolite strikes; the militant Auto Strikes in G. M. and Chrysler; the sitdowns; organization of at least 5 million new workers, especially in the mass production industry.

Against this wave of militancy two interlocked currents were organized. On the one hand the biggest faker in the A.F. of L., John L. Lewis, who sensed what was happening and in order to behead this wave of militancy and incidentally in order to bring in some dues to fill the treasury — began organizing the mass production industry on a policy of CLASS COLLABORATION. For two years the workers fought so hard Lewis had to yield to some of their strikes and sitdowns. Now, however, he's got everything in tow again, and the same burocratic practices, the same role of working hand in hand with the capitalist owners that prevailed in the United Mine Workers now prevails throughout the whole CIO. No wonder "Business Week", magazine of big business, feels so sure there will be no strike at General Motors or on the West Coast!

NEW DEAL STRAITJACKET

Simultaneous with Mr. Lewis and his CIO, the New Deal government forged step by step the shackles which headed strike sentiment when the it is now trying to put on labor.
