GERMANY DEFEATS FRENCH BOSSES FRENCH WORKERS CAN STILL SMASH FASCISM AND PREVENT SPREAD OF WAR

After 70 years Paris is again in the hands of a German conqueror. The defeat of the French armies and the treachery of the French bourgeoisie in 1870 caused the working class at that time to revolt and set up the now famous Paris Commune - the first Dictatorship of the Proletariat. A few deadly parallels with 1871 are inescapable in the present situation:

First, the treacherous role of the bourgeoisie has repeated itself all over again. It will be remembered that even long after the present war was declared, the Comite des Forges, French steel syndicate, continued a lucrative business with the German munition plants via Luxemburg. The coal deposits also found their way to German manufacturers by the same route and Belgium. The French bosses found the

maintenance of profits the high-est expression of their "patriotism", meanwhile piling up oppres-sive taxes on the working class.

PROFITS FOR BOSSES

Second, unstinted profiteering has held sway throughout this war, despite the "national unity" decreed by the government. No effort was made to limit profits by placing a ceiling on the price of consumption goods. The masses found themselves facing a more brutal oppressor at home than was threatening them from abroad.

GERMAN VICTORY IN FRANCE GIVES BIG PUSH TO U.S. WAR MOVE

LABOR DONALE

After 39 days of the most far-reaching military offensive in history the French bourgeoisie is suing for a separate peace. What are the effects of the new relationship of forces?

1-The war is not yet over. France may cede colonies to Italy and Germany in the peace agreement — if it is reached — but in order to get those colonies the Axis will have to fight for them against the British navy. The French may even formally give up the navy to the Germans, but to actually get hold of the ships the Nazis will have to send out their own navy to defeat the British, who undoubtedly even at this moment are rounding up French ships and preparing to force them to surrender or to destroy them. It is highly doubtful if Germany will get even half of the tonnage of the French



2-The next campaign of the war will now turn in one of two directions: either a frontal attack on the British Isles, or mopping up in central Europe for the big "Drang nach Osten", the march to the east.

EXPOSE THE WAR-MAKERS

Third, the incapacity of the allies has been completely revealed Their military strategy again. has been unchanged since 1918 They have learned nothing and forgotten nothing. They prepared vast immobilized fortresses that proved to be nothing but a detriment in the war of movement. They trained troops for trench warfare, and no trenches have been establshed - never has the German machine slowed up enough to allow time for digging in.

An even more salient point, Germany has far more troops in the field today than the combined force of the Allies. Yet greater Germany has a populaton of some 88 million, against a total over 650 million for the allies, including their colonies. How has this happened?

The reasons are not far to seek. The decay of imperialism is so deep-seated that the colonies

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WHY A GERMAN IMPERIALIST VICTORY OVER FRANCE

The onmarch of the Nazi blitzkrieg which has now rolled into Paris and forced France to surrender has raised the entire question of military strategy and tactics to the point where all the military big-wigs are trying to figure out how to combat the German lightning war of movement.

The Anglo-French and American militarists are attempting to determine how to perfect their military machine to counter-attack against Germany. They therefore have to pose the question of the economic-military base of the German war machine.

Some of the economic and military aspects of the GEOISIE! German war machine merely reflect the status of German Imperialism. Hitler inherited the second highest national economic unit in the world. Only United States surpassed AGAINST THE PROFIT SYSTEM! it. It was the Young and Dawes Plan and the "Americanization of German economy that reorganized this productive apparatus while the Anglo-French economic structures lagged. This economic structure, in spite of its deep internal decay, was utilized negatively by Fascism, not to "organize production" but to organize destruction — war production.

GERMANY PERFECTED STRATEGY

In military strategy Germany learned from the Spanish and Polish campaign; while England and France seem to have learned nothing from these valuable lessons. In fact the embryo of Hitler's main military strategy was taken from the Spanish campaign. These are the real aims of the Anglo-French and American imperialists.

Yes, the workers are for the defeat of Fascist dictatorship and organized starvation. italism. This is an epoch of wars and revolutions. France and England, instead of drawing heavily on their colonials, have rather been forced to maintain large standing armies in the Near East. India, and Africa to prevent national revolutionary movements from breaking out in all their strength.

It is variously estimated that Britain and France are unwilling. to use more than one colonial troop to each four of the home troops, otherwise they would be faced with constant national mut-

One more deadly parallel remains for history to enact.

FRANCE WEAK LINK

When the war started last September, we stated that France was one of weakest links of the capitalist chain, just as Russia was in the last war. The deep-seated unrest and militancy in France, which was brewing toward revolutionary upheaval before the out-break of the war, is now again coming to the surface.

The crisis in the French government, the resignation of Reynaud, indicate that the masses are greatly dissatisfied. Should France sign a separate peace, the masses will still have an opportunity. Before the Nazi butchers can con-solidate the totalitarian regime over France the revolution will yet break out.

The French worker already sees clearly how the French bourgeoisie places property relations and profits ever higher than patces, besides the sale of war goods to the German conqueror (even today we venture to say) the French bourgeoisie handed over the great factories of Paris without even blowing them up or rendering them useless. They would rather that the Germans used the means of production to build more tanks and planes to slaughtor French soldiers. than destroy their profits and wealth.
