July 20 - Two faces of American Imperialism, with identical imperialist aims, but representing two different sections of the financiers, have been placed before the American electorate in the quadrennial hoax of a "free" and "democratic" presidential election.

Both Wendell Willkie and Franklin Roosevelt are for immediate preparation for entry into the war, for consolidating the western hemisphere through reciprocal trade

SECONDARY DIFFERENCES

But from this point on there are many secondary differences.

The Democrats put forth a strong, positive, bourgeois reform-ist platform re-emphasizing the social aims of the New Deal. The Republican program was made deliberately vague to cover up the more open dictatorial meas-ures which Mr. Willkie will introduce if elected. FASCISM OR WORKERS' REVOLUTION AGAIN PROVED TO BE ONLY CHOICE FOR SOCIETY

Information as to developments in France and the capitulation of decisive sections of the French bosses and the puppet statesmen to Fascism is being suppressed by the boss class press in the United States. They do not want the workers here to get the FULL facts as to what has happened. For these facts would again give vivid proof to one of the most fundamental issues confronting society:

Either the Crumbling of Fake Boss Class "Democracy" and the Establishment of a Brutal Fascist Regime in its place --- or Workers Revolution and the Establishment of a Workers Council Geveniment based on Workers Control of Production for use!

There is no other road for society to traverse.

The chain of development since the last World War has made this choice incontrovertibly clear:

Fascism in Italy following the failure of the workers' seizure of factories to develop into a successful revolution; Fascism in Germany due to the treachery of the Second and Third Internationals who betrayed the workers' struggles; Fascism in Spain owing to the disastrous Peoples Front boss class regime, supported by the Socialist, Stalinist, Anarchist and other revisionists through material aid such as the Trotskyites.

And now - Fascism in France. The government established at Vichy where the French Parliament had "voted" itself out of existence and surrendered the state apparatus to a handful of politicians - Petain, Weygand, and Laval, (who yesterday was praised as an outstanding representative of French democracy and who is now of the Fascist regime) this government is proceeding to smash the trade unions, to build a one-party system, to outlaw all political organizations, to launch an anti-Semitic drive, to take all the steps that mark an emerging full-fledged Fascist regime.

"DEMOCRATIC" POLITICIANS HEAD FASCIST REGIME

How does it happen that the very men who yesterday were calling upon the French workers to "defend democracy against Fascism" are now intent upon establishing a Fascist regime under German hegemony??

The answer may be summed up in the words of General Petain when he urged surrender to Hitler: "If we do not surrender there will be a workers defense of Paris and mutinies throughout the army"!

In other words they say: If we do not make peace with Hitler, the working class will rise up and destroy both us and Hitler. And these stooge statesmen of the French capitalists, many of whom have for years been preparing their Fascist coup d'etat, even to the point of sabotaging the military structure against Hitler . these "statesmen" now expose to the hilt the very rotteness of bourgeois "democracy" by making peace with Hitler and moving to establish a Fascist government.

They fear the workers more than they do Hitler. They use Hitler's methods to suppress the workers.

THE FRENCH BOSSES CHOOSE FAS-CISM IN ORDER TO SUPPRESS THE WORKERS STRUGGLES: and they thereby show that they understand fully well that brutal Fascist dictatorship is the only method left to them to maintain their rotting and decayed profit system.

PEOPLES FRONT PAVED THE WAY FOR FASCISM

Again, as in the case of Spain, the ground for the Fascists was paved in advance by Peoples Frontism. It was under the Blum Peoples Front regime, supported by the Socialists and Stalinists, that the French bosses were able to stifle the revolutionary ferment of the workers, were able to lull the workers into support of that "democratic" regime, to whittle down their fighting forces, sap away their militancy — and at the appropriate time, to destroy their gains of the 1936 strike the Daladier Bonapartist military dictatorship which still appeared in hypocritical fashion as a "democratic" regime.

LEARN THE LESSONS

The lessons of this course of development in France must be clearly understood by all workers in order to prevent further such tragedies:

1-No support to the Peoples Front (Labor Party, etc.) which paves the way for Fascism.

2-No material aid to any "left" bourgeois government. Only independent working class action.

3-Support of Blum, Daladier, Reynaud, etc., "against" the Fascists enabled French Fascism to take over power in France. Independent working class action would have resulted in another Paris Commune that could have been the beginning of the struggle to drive Fascism out of Europe.

4-The "peace" of the French bosses with German Imperialism does not bring the imperialists war toward its end; rather it deepens and extends the contradictions in Europe and prepares the way for greater imperialist and class conflicts.

5-ONLY THE SMASHING OF CAP-**ITALISM CAN SMASH FASCISM!**

6-ONLY THE REVOLUTIONARY OV-ERTHROW OF CAPITALISM CAN END THE IMPERIALIST WAR.

GPU MURDER-TRY AT TROTSKY BLOW AGAINST DEMOCRATIC RIGHTS OF WORKING CSASS

The R.W.L. has often made clear its complete condemnation of hoodlum and gangster tactics employed in the labor movement by one group against another. The most outstanding examples of which have been the criminal activities of the Stalinist parties and their GUP murder-clique.

Now the coldblooded murderous attempt on the life of Leon Trotsky calls for a vigorous restatement of our views and an emphatic condemnation of the GPU and the Stalinist parties. For they stand exposed to the hilt as criminal assassins.

First, the incitement to the deed can be found in every word which the international, and Mexican, Stalinist press has ever uttered on the subject of Leon Trotsky.

STALINISTS CLEARLY GUILTY

Second, the arrest by the Mexican police of known and admitted members of the Communist Party clearly demonstrates that, with or without the official knowledge of the Party itself - but certainly at the express command of the GPU representative in the Mexican Stalinist Party — this criminal assassination was attempted.

We have nothing in common with the political views of Leon Trotsky, and have often vigorously polemicized against them; but we regard the attempt on his life as another in a long list of crimes against the working class which must be laid at the door of the Stalinism.

This attempted assassination occurs just when the bourgeois begin cracking down on the Stalinist themselves. The railroading of Hathaway to the penitentiary for libel on a fake issue is clearly a dastardly frame-up by the boss government. So is the vicious campaign to imprison Browder on the flimsy passport charge.

BOSS CLASS ATTACKS

We protest and expose these attacks of the bourgeoisie against these Stalinists, not because we in any way endorse Stalinism --- which is guilty of the same kind of crimes within the working class movoment - but because this is a part of the boss class drive against the democratic rights of the working class.

BOSSES LIE ABOUT PROFITS TO CONCEAL EXPLOITATION

The reactionary Chicago Tribune of July 6th publishes a touching tale of the taxes of the 183 leading industrial organizations. It seems according to Col. McCormick that more than 54% of the total gross profits of the 183 companies go for taxes of all kinds.

Gross profits were somewhere around 3 billion 800 millions, of which taxes took up 2 billions, and net income this proviso to make for a \$21 after taxes were 1 billion 750 millions - or about a return of 4% on the 45½ billions of assets of these companies. Which isn't so bad even at that! U. S. Steel, for instance, made NET profit of 41 million dollars even after paying 67 millions for taxes. Standard Oil of New Jersey made a cool 89 million dollars, after paying 120 millions in taxes. And General Motors made 183 million dollars after kicking in only 101 millions to state, local, and federal governments.

SLIGHT "OVERSIGHTS"

Let's just list a few of the "little" things the Trib icians are giving are less and less acceptable. overlooked:

1-Total surplus value MUST add to the so-called net income the interest paid on bonds. The profits of the trades which will exempt them industrial firms are distributed partially among its stockholders and partially among its bondholders. Added to means been able to fill the estabthis we must also include interest paid to banks and ban-lished quotas kers on short term loans, 60 day notes, etc. The Tribune figures count the profits of the coupon-clippers and the interest paid the bankers as "expense", rather than what they are - a DIFFERENT FORM OF THE APPROPRIA-TION OF SURPLUS VALUE.

2-The profits of the landlords owning the property of the 183 companies — the rent, in other words, over and above the cost of improvement - is left out.

3-Then comes the usual famous accounting frauds of the capitalist system. As everyone knows, the good capitalist accountants always put "depreciation" down as an expense. And in the present period, according to such authorities as the Daily News of Chicago, the amount set aside for depreciation is as high as 30% and 40% - in other words capitalists are deducting from profits and unskilled youth in New York 30% of the total of their assets on the faked argument

Burton Wheeler, tial candidate. Burton Wheeler, prominent isolationist, and his supporter John L. Lewis were bought off by an innocently wor-ded war plank, stating that Am-erican boys will not be sent abroad. Wheeler and Lewis were quick to jump the bandwaggon when they felt the pulse of the convention; both know that the words of the "peace" plank are of no value whatsoever, that Roosevelt will pursue any policy he likes. The possibility of a third-party to the left of Roosevelt is now, with this deal and sell-out, almost excluded.

Incidentally the peace plank is very interesting. Five words were added to the original: not to send troops abroad except in case of attack". In other words if an American ship is attacked Cuba by a German submarine, in or if the democrats THINK it was attacked, that constitutes reasons for sending American troops abroad. Quite obviously the whole plank is merely a farce. SWEDISH SOCIAL PATRIOTISM

"In Sweden, since the Russo-Finnish war the reactionary regime has been proceeding with all possible severity against the emigres, as daily increasing overtures toward Germany are made; emigre suicides are quite frequent and it is impossible to think of carrying on political work there; the whole land stands under Germany's pressure. The Socialist Party made a sharp turn to the right since the war's beginning; the left wing followed it almost completely after the Russian attack on Finland, and the SP is now the extreme anti-German anti-Russian wing of all Swedish Social-Democracy. Perhaps if we could send some material from the United States and reestablish contact with a few comrades, we might save them

"At the moment we know practically nothing of the fate of our other comrades in Norway, Poland, Lithuania, Denmark, Holland, Belgium or northern France. We can reveal only one glimpse of this terrible situation: over half of our emigres have again fallen into the hands of Hitler and his bloodhounds as a result of recent developments; an unthinkable horrible fate awaits them.

"Only scattered reports trickle through to us: in one place in northern France, Will Mahrer, former member of the Youth Central Committee of the Red Front fell into the hands of the Germans and either committed suicide or was murdered. However a showdown cannot be avoidd, but the show down can be brought to a modified conclusion providing Uncle Sam is willing to pend enough. Both candidates claim to be elected. Both candidates are to the right of Cardenas. Cardenas picked a right wing candidate to replace him in order to placate the demands of American imperialism and endeavor to negate the pressure of the opposing candidate Almazan.

But reports from the comrades in Mexico state that Almazan had enormous popular support, that the working class was apathetic to the candidacy of Camacho. The Stalinist, Toledano labor burocracy actually had to mobilize thousands of workers from their factories and bring them to the polls to vote.

BOTH UNDER U. S. CONTROL

Both candidates are under the domination of American imperialism. Even though Almazan has 'secret" support of the Axis powers, the American interests still have the upper hand. Dissatisfied

and mining interests, impatient with the Roosevelt-Hull policy want a candidate even to the right of Camacho.

In the final analysis American imperialism can determine who will be "elected" in Mexico. Their economic and military measures now being carried out in the whole of Latin America demand a candidate in Mexico who "un-derstands" their needs under the Monroe Doctrine.

The Cardenas "Peoples Front" has disorientated and lulled to sleep workers and oppressed masto such a degree that a candidate a few steps to the right, such as Camacho, will be most able to handle the situation.

HITLER LIES

According to Adolph Hitler's lying statisticians only 18,000 German youth were slaughtered in the recent blitzkrieg. How so gross a lie could be peddled to an unsuspecting public it is difficult to conceive.

The short street-fighting Vienna in 1934 cost over 8,000 struggle between communism and workers lives alone. The Dutch fascism, with bourgeois democraarmy lost 100,000 soldiers in 4 1/2 cy always playing the role of bedays, according to their comman-der-in-chief. The City of Rotter-dam lost more than 100,00 civil-

ians in those same few days. Obviously an offensive along 250 miles, for almost 2 months, involving over 2 million German soldiers must have cost at least 20 or 30 times the 18,000 dead that Hitler claims.

That there is a shortage of manpower is indicated by the fact that only a few weeks ago, according to information we have from authoritative German com-rades, men in military plants in Germany (many of them revolutionists) were called to the colors as replacements.

on the New Deal to recognize General Almazan at this stage it would indicate that the American imperialists fear grave class disorders in Mexico and hope to put in a strong reactionary force that will begin the process of bleeding the workers white.

Thus Mexico continues along the road that Italy, Germany, Austria, Spain and now France have travelled. The road all capitalists in decay capitalism must travel. The road that brings to in the surface the fundamental trayal and paving the way for fascism because they fear the proletariat a thousand times more than they fear fascism.
