It is more difficult and there is Union off gold. There will be unfavorable effect of world-wide devaluation on Soviet economy. But the monopoly of foreign trade will ushion the shocks.

Moreover, the Soviet Union is not an active rival in the world narket nor even, at present, a very mportant factor.

The Stalinists threw a relatively small amount of sterling on the market in a futile and foolish attempt to disrupt the three-cornered agreement. Inasmuch as the arrangement favored the U.S. more than it benefitted its rivals. Secretary of the Treasury, Morgenthau, angrily reproved the Soviet Union.
