The following is the full text of the 1952 Election Platform adopted by the recent national convention of the Socialist Workers Party which nominated Farrell Dobbs and Myra Tanner Weiss as candidates for President and Vice President of the United States:

We are told every day that Americans live in a special paradise-on-earth," the richest, the most peaceful, the most stable country in the world.

But the truth is we face disaster.

We stand on the brink of the most destructive of all wars. Half the peoples of the world will be ranged against us. It is doubtful that we can win such a war. But whether our generals win or lose, we, the American people, will be the losers. Millions of our sons, brothers and husbands will lose their lives on foreign battle fronts in the remotest corners of the world. Our cities will be pounded by bombs, turned into rubble as were Coventry and London, Berlin and Hamburg, Hiroshima and Nagasaki in the last war.

The military machine will devour our great national wealth and resources. Our standard of living will be driven down to the European level. Our cherished rights and liberties will be trampled underfoot by a military dictatorship. Labor will be regimented and dissenters locked up in concentration camps.

- This is the tomorrow our rulers are planning for us and our children. And it is later than most of us think. In the midst of our present seeming well-being such a prospect looks like sheer madness. But it is not the common people who have lost their reason, it is not they who are plotting national suicide. It is the capitalist system under which we live, the giant banks and monopolies which dominate it and the politicians of the two major parties who serve their interest. These are the real betrayers of our country. They are the enemy within the gates.

6. Inflation

Inflation is one of the major enemies of the workers' standard of living. Chief cause of this disguised wage cutting is the huge war budget, and government-sponsored profiteering. Price increases, such as the boost in steel prices, are allowed by Big Business, while wages are curbed

Abolish the wage freeze. Produce for peace, not for war.

For committees of unionists, housewives and small merchants authorized to stop profiteering and control prices and rents.

For a compulsory cost-of-living clause covering all wages, pensions and unemployment compensation, based upon a labor-controlled cost-of-living index which would include Federal, state and local taxes in computing living costs.

7. Taxes

The government's tax policy shifts the burden of war costs to the workers and low income groups. The billionaires are allowed to continue their record-breaking profits. Workers' wages are taxed in many forms, direct and indirect. Taxation is rapidly becoming the biggest menace to the standard of living won by American workers through years of struggle. What is won on the picket line is taken away by Washington.

Tax the rich and not the poor.

Abolish all taxes on incomes below \$7,500 a year. Abolish all sales taxes. Stop the war profiteers by a 100% tax on all war-goods profits.

8. Security and Welfare

The so-called "Fair Deal" welfare program promised by Truman in 1948 has been put in moth balls. It was only a campaign promise. Now it is being taken out of storage for the 1952 campaign. The Republicans and Democrats will never enact a genuine public welfare program. Their Smith Act, and loyalty oaths and "subversive" lists. The Truth About Socialism

In this country the revolutionary socialist movement is, as yet, a minority movement. It is therefore hardly surprising that misconceptions, let alone deliberate falsehoods, concerning socialism are widely prevalent. The chief sufferers from this ignorance about socialism have been the mass of the American people; the chief beneficiaries are the tiny minority of capitalist rulers.

The first socialist truth that the American people urgently need to learn is that the existing levels of produc- You were very good on TV. tion and technology can assure a high living standard for every man, woman and child not only in this country but the world over.

Yet, amid this vast potential of plenty, humanity still suffers from poverty, misery and hunger. Even in this country, not every family is adequately fed, sufficiently clothed and properly sheltered. In fact, today, as in the days of the terrible depression in the Thirties, one-third, of the nation remains undernourished, ill-clothed, ill- thoughts. We need more men like I am very deeply interested in party. Millions of people want to housed.

Technology makes one remarkable advance after another. Machines multiply human productivity tenfold, a hundredfold and more. But the day's labor of human beings, attached to these marvellous machines, has not been lightened. We continue to toil as inhumanly as before. And te crown it all, our living standards decline not only relatively but absolutely. This is especially true for scores of millions of West European workers who produce more than they ever did, but whose living standards have fallen below prewar levels. The same fate awaits the American workers.

This is a monstrous contradiction. It is the inescapable product of the way in which modern society is organized and run. Modern industry cannot operate except on a mass-production basis and for world-wide distribution. In other words, our industrial process has been socialized. But industry remains individually owned and operated for private profit.

Private ownership of the basic means of production arose in the dim past of mankind, in the days of universal scarcity and universal impoverishment. To maintain itself, this private-ownership system must artificially reproduce conditions of scarcity and keep the mass of mankind impoverished.

Its primary source of wealth is the exploitation of man by man. Every advance of science and technology is utilized to perpetuate this barbaric exploitation under conditions of poverty, misery, hunger.

Such a system is one of human degradation. Such a system is self-destructive. This has been glaringly disclosed by the periodic economic crises that have convulsed capitalism since its birth some three centuries ago. This has been underscored since the turn of the Twentieth Century by the periodic wars, which have become a component part of capitalism, and without which it is no longer able even to function.

Socialism will take the already socialized industrial cess out of private hands in order to operate it for the benefit of society as a whole. It will institute planned production whose basic aim is to guarantee every human bedividual will be required to contribute in his or her lifetime the necessary minimum of socially useful activity. For the first time, the economic life of our planet will be placed on a rational, planned, scientific foundation.

Who Is the Aggressor?

We are told that the Korean war is a necessary defensive action against "communist aggression." Our country is threatened, the capitalist propagandists say, by Chinese and Soviet "imperialism." Many Americans believe this fantastic lie.

How does this claim square with the facts? On July 30 sixty-six U.S. B-29 bombers blasted an aluminum plant tions sent me. four miles from the Chinese-Manchurian border. What is this but an arrogant threat to the freedom and independence of China?

If Chinese planes bombed the Canadian city of Windsor, just across the river from Detroit, there is little question that Washington would immediately declare war: But U.S. bombings just a stone's throw from China on the North Korean side of the Yalu river is called a "step toward peace."

The American government has sent tanks, planes, piles of armaments and 800 officers to fortify the Formosa bastion of bloody dictator Chiang Kai-shek, just off the China coast. What would happen if the Chinese government supplied arms and military personnel to fortify the island of Cuba under the rule of some anti-American despot?

What would the State Department say if the Soviet government installed a puppet regime in Canada, built up its military strength, occupied it with Russian troops, banned pro-American newspapers and patrolled the U.S. coast with its Navy? It would mean war. But that is exactly what the U.S. is doing in Japan, with military bases directly threatening the Soviet maritime provinces around Vladivostok.

The U.S. invasion of Korea, a small nation bordering on China, is comparable to an invasion of Mexico bordering the U.S. on the South. Say a civil war broke out in Mexico and Soviet troops intervened. Wouldn't this be called a provocation?

The facts are that the Korean war 6,000 miles from our shores is an aggressive threat to the security and independence of China, and U.S. military outposts in Asia point the gun at the USSR and all the countries of the Far East.

The enemy of world peace is right here at home. Wall Street and the Pentagon are deliberately planning a catastrophic Third World War.

The Negro Struggle -**Democrat Plank on FEPC**

By Joseph Hansen

Last week, Albert Parker proved in this column that the Republican plank on civil rights "was especially written to satisfy the Jim Crow South." He said that "the Republicans feel they don't have to offer their Negro members any concessions" because Negro Republican leaders "don't even fight for them."

Now let's take a good look at the Democratic plank on civil rights. Here is the key sentence: "We also favor legislation to perfect existing Federal civil rights statutes and to strengthen the administrative machinery for the protection of civil rights."

A lynch-minded Dixiecrat is not very rational, but it is difficult to see how the most rabid racist could object to a proposal "to perfect" existing statutes. As was intended, they can interpret that any way they please.

In addition, the Democrats included a plank in which they "urge that action be taken" to "improve Congressional procedures so that majority rule prevails and decisions can be made after reasonable debate without being blocked by a minority in either house." This was a concession to those wanting to put an end to Dixiecrat use of the filibuster against civil rights legislation. It is meaningless. What is to prevent Dixiecrat filibuster against such a token "action" to improve the procedure of Congress?

Compared with the 1948 plank, the Democrats moved backward. At that time Truman was ready to promise anything for a vote. He knew that if he was elected the promises would be in safe hands; and as a matter of fact when he got back in the White House he filed them in the waste basket in the usual manner. To capture the vote of labor and the Negro people, he had to outpromise Henry Wallace, phrase-mongering candidate of the Progressive Party in 1948. And so Truman made his civil rights plank so "strong" that the Dixiecrats split away in protest. This year they didn't split. And for good reason.

The real aim of the watered-down 1952 plank is to meet Republican competition in bidding for the Dixiecrat vote. However, the liberals hailed it at first as an improvement over 1948! The July 24 N. Y. Post, for instance, ran a headline: "Dixie Yells Fade Before Historic Civil Rights Plank." This liberal paper backed that startling statement with the following report from Chicago: "The Dixiecrats were docile about it. Without a single rebel yell and with only a few doleful 'noes' they accepted early today a Democratic Party civil rights plank much tougher than the one that caused them to bolt the convention four years ago."

The editors of the Post are out to sell the Democratic Party no matter how they have to lie to do it. However, it is difficult to understand

It was he, as a member of the committee that drew up the Democratic platform, who made sure this particular plank was acceptable to the Southern Bourbons.

Stevenson himself, of course, was chosen to head the Democratic ticket because of his acceptability to the Dixiecrats. He is for the "states approach" and for "education" and all the other vague and pleasant-sounding platitudes that are the stock in trade of Northern capitalist politicians anxious to keep in the good graces of their phrenetic Southern allies.

The Democratic plank was an insult to every one concerned about civil rights. Rep. Adam Clayton Powell (D., N. Y.) called a public meeting to protest the "sellout of the Negro people" by the Democratic and Republican conventions. He said that it would be "sheer death" for a Negro leader to try to "sell" Sparkman. "They can cram a candidate down our throats but they cannot make us vote for him."

I'm sure Powell feels that such strong language is demanded by the situation, especially the situation in his district in Harlem. It will have a more sincere sound, however, when Powell backs it up with his resignation from the Democratic party and calls for formation of a Labor party. The big lesson to be learned in all this is that

the Negro people and their leaders have no business in either the Democratic or Republican parties. To win in the struggle for full equality it is necessary to fight and to fight effectively. That means above all building an independent political force, a Labor party, an instrument of political action far more powerful than anything the miserable, loud-mouthed, Dixiecrat spokesmen for Jim Crow and minority rule can muster.

"I Wish Jerry Was Dead" . By Harry Ring

Notes from the News

On Saturday, July 19, Jerry Andrian, a 29-yearold Navy veteran, fired five bullets into the back of a cab driver in San Antonio, Texas, because, he explained, "God told me to do it."

Four years of the monstrous hell of "combat duty" in the second World War to preserve "our way of life" cast Jerry's mind into a new shape. Forces beyond his control impelled him to kill an innocent man. Jerry feels these forces as the will of "God."

But Jerry's intelligent mother, a resident of Newark, N J., understands who really pulled the trigger. She told the true story in an interview in the July 21 issue of the Newark Evening News. It is a scathing indictment of the criminal refusal of a rotten social order to even attempt to heal the minds that it has shattered.

"The doctors were very polite about it," she recalled. "They said Jerry was a nice boy, that he was sick, but not sick enough to remain in the hospital. They said he might get dangerous but they didn't think that would happen for many years."

"Please forgive me if I sound bitter," Mrs. Andrian told the News reporter. "I just can't help believing society was guilty of the murder they say my son committed."

She talked about Jerry's harrowing war experiences, how he had narrowly escaped death in a plane crash that killed the pilot. She explained that with this shock he became obsessed with the doctrines of Buddhism, Hinduism and Rosicrucianism. "I never questioned Jerry much about his mystical studies," Mrs. Andrian said. "I didn't want to embarrass him. From what he told me I gathered he imagined himself another messiah who was put on earth to free men of their sins."

After receiving a medical discharge from the Navy, Mrs. Andrian said, Jerry enrolled at Columbia University in New York as a student of music and social science. Troubled by headaches, restlessness and despondency, he applied for aid at Bellevue Hospital in 1948. Bellevue sent him to Kings Park State Hospital, a mental institution on Long Island. A short while later he was released over her objections.
