Recognition of China Is First Requirement For Peace in Asia

If the Korean war is still draining the blood of Amercan youth; if the U.S. military negotiators at Panmunjom haggle over every tiny point and raise new demands with each concession offered by the other side; if incitations and threats are hurled every day from the floors of Congress to whip up sentiment for

an all-out war against China, it is because Wall Street is determined to restore capitalist dom-ination over China's 450-million people.

America's financial and business rulers do not want to recognize the existing government of China, although it is a million times more representative of the Chinese people than the vile dic-tatorship of Chiang Kai-shek whom the Chinese threw off their backs and drove over the sca to his island hide-out of Formosa. Diplomatic expediency and world-wide pressure may incline Eisenhower to some peace gestures and maneuvers and even to consider a possible temporary deal with the Kremlin. But up to now he and his administration have shown only hostility to the proposal for recognition of the New China government - the issue on which the question of peace in the Far East is most immediately hinged.

WITCH-HUNT LAWS **CREATE ATMOSPHERE** FOR McCARTHYISM

Senator Joseph McCarthy's intimidation and smear tactics thrive in the general witch-hunt atmosphere created by the "anti-Communist" drive of both Republican and Democrats, including the so-called "liberals."

The growing number of legal restrictions on "Communists" and "subversive" organizations testifies to the source of the atmosphere which is so favorable to the growth of McCarthyism. These legal restraints are supplemented by government executive orders, plus policies adopted by private concerns and agencies, designed to victimize and silence those whose views deviate in the slightest from those of the Big Business reactionaries.

Recently the Subversives Activities Control Board, set up under the McCarran Internal Security Act of 1950. ruled that the law requires the Communist Party to list all its officers and members every year, make a full public accounting of the sources and recipients of its funds, name its contributors and label as "Communist" all mail and bundles it sends out.

If the courts uphold this ruling, it will mean that the way will be open to force any organization the attorney. general arbitrarily labels as "suversive" or "Communistcontrolled" to expose its membership and make them subject to witch-hunt reprisals.

Under the guise of barring "Communists" and "subversives," most states have laws making it very difficult and even impossible for minority parties to get on the ballot.

Laws to deny "Communists" or "subversives" the right to run for office are on the books in 26 states. Most of the other states have similar restrictive election laws which make it difficult for so-called "subversives" to get on the ballot. The first victim of the Trucks police-state law in Michigan was not the Communist Party, but the Socialist Workers Party, whose candidates were removed. from the ballot last year and restored only after legal action was taken.

"Communists" or "subversives" are denied the right to federal jobs. Millions of federal employes are being interrogated, investigated and otherwise harassed in the vast government "loyalty" purge, first instituted by Truman, and recently intensified by Eisenhower.

In 28 states, anyone called a "Communist" or "subversive" is denied the right to any state or municipal job - even in such a "sensitive" work as street-cleaning.

Under the Taft-Hartley law, unions which want to have dealings with the National Labor Relations Board must get rid of any "Communist" leaders. Many union financial dealings of witch-hunt- Seven loans, totaling \$37,500,000 additions to the Housing Act. One mitted. Those detained may not leaders themselves have instituted provisions in union constitutions to bar "Communists" from holding office and even membership.

The rights of school teachers and college professors are under severe attack. There are special "loyalty" oaths required of school teachers in 32 states. Most colleges and universities bar anyone labelled a "Communist" from teaching, a policy recommended not by McCarthy, but by the American Association of University Professors.

"Communists" are denied the right to hold meetings in school buildings in 11 states and hundreds of local school boards enforce similar restrictions.

How to Get a School

They're going to get a new school to replace the the May 15 Labor's Daily, Amer- delapidated 60-odd-year old Maxfield public school in St. ica's only daily labor newspaper, Paul. This doesn't sound like big exciting news compared to the war headlines, say, but it's mighty important to the parents and kids, Negro and white, who've been demanding that new school building for a long while. Naturally, we're glad to hear the good news, for their sake. But what makes it really important to all of us, is the way they got the school board to agree to the new school building.

> What they did was threaten to "strike" - keep all their children out of school until the board approved a new building. But I'm anticipating a bit, so I'll tell more about the strike angle after I give you the background.

The issue of the Maxfield school was especially hot nouncement that a network of because half the pupils are Negroes. Housing restrictions keep the majority of the Negroes confined to this area and they can't move away to a neighborhood with a better school. The politicians didn't want to spend money on a school with a high percentage of Negro children; and, in a way, this made the white kids at Maxfield victims of Jim Crow too.

> Of course, the voters in the area had been given the usual election promise back in 1950 that they would be given a new school. But once the election campaign was over, the new school board members dropped their promise down the well.

Last winter, the Maxfield PTA. St. Paul NAACP. St. Paul Urban League, Dining Car Employees' Local 516, persons adjudged subversive or AFL, and St. Paul Ministerial Alliance sent a joint delegation of 100 parents and area residents to the school board meeting. They again got the runaround.

They then collected a petition of 1,642 voters in the area and presented it to the school board. The board members blandly told them that plans were afoot merely to "rehabilitate" the old tottering structure instead of building a new one. That's when the parents really began to burn up.

They voted to "strike" and issued a mimeographed call to action. It concluded:

"That parents be ready upon SHORT NOTICE TO KEEP THEIR CHILDREN OUT OF SCHOOL if the board votes to PATCH UP THIS OLD BUILDING.

"TO CONTINUE TO KEEP THEIR CHILDREN OUT OF SCHOOL until a settlement is made.

"PLANS ARE MADE TO CARE FOR CHILDREN WHOSE PARENTS ARE UNABLE TO KEEP THEM AT HOME.

"REMEMBER THAT WE HAVE NOTHING TO LOSE — WE HAVE NOTHING!"

Well, at their next meeting, on May 1, the School Board members whined and complained about how wrong it was for parents to threaten a "strike." But, you know what? They voted that same night to build a new building as soon as the voters approve the necessary bond issue.

You might say that this is another good example of how the wheel that squeals gets the grease. But it's more than that. In two states, Pennsylvania and Ohio, "subversives" are denied unemployment compensation.

Those accused of being "Communist" or "subversive" are denied the right to federal low-rent housing. They are denied commissions in the armed forces and their activities as enlisted men are greatly restricted.

They can't get passports to visit abroad. If non-citi-They can't get passports to visit abroad. If non-citi-zens they face deportation; if foreigners wanting to visit NEGRO MILITANCY WINS here, they cannot get entrance permits.

There are no federal laws that make the Communist Party or any other "subversive" nolitical group illegal. Three states - Georgia. Pennsylvania and Massachusetts - have such laws, but these have not been tested in the courts. Yet in every state in the union, the constitutional rights of people whom the officials choose to call "Communists" are violated in one way or another.

Even where they formally have a minimum of rights. they can still be framed up under the Smith "Gag" Act for "conspiracy to advocate and teach" the "forceful overthrow of the government."

17,000,000 Strong

Organized labor in the U.S. now stands at the all-time high of nearly 17,000,000 members. One-half million of this giant force were gained in the last three years according to the latest survey by the Labor Department. This brings the number of unionized workers to 28% of the nation's total labor force of 61,518,000.

Where there is growth there is life, and this expansion of membership testifies to the vitality of the union movement. If you consider that the half million increase took place despite the union-busting Taft-Hartley Act and the anti-labor atmosphere of witch hunting then the growth of the unions assumes even greater significance.

The growth did not occur automatically. Last year was the greatest single strike year since the turbulent post-war strike wave of 1946.

Of the 17,000,000 union members, 9,-500,000 belong to the AFL, 5,000,000 to the CIO and over 2,000,000 to independent unions and the Railroad Brotherhoods. The three largest contingents of this vast army are the CIO Auto Workers with 1,-184,507 members and the CIO Steelworkers and AFL Teamsters each with a membership of over 1.000.000. The ranks of organized labor include today 3,000,000 women.

There is a great and incalculable power in these numbers. The union movement is the largest single organized force in the country. Its members at the point of production are the most strategically situated elements of the population. Without them the wheels of industry, the nerve centers of communication and the lanes of transport would be paralyzed. Cavallaro, a Catholic appointed to the board in 1946 by Mayor O'Dwyer, was elected 11 to 9 in an executive session that barred the presidents of four colleges. Several board members called it a "blitz." In his first public statement, this witch hunter praised the sinister activities of McCarthy, Jenner and Velde, saying they "have done a good job" in investigating "subversion" in the schools and that "the school board should finish it."

The elation among the McCarthyite forces was matched by the gloom among the liberals. The Democratic N. Y. Post, the Liberal Party, the AFL Teachers Guild and the Public Education Association are all bemoaning Cavallaro's election.

They have good reason for this, for the witch hunt has extended to their ranks. Last year, for instance, Dr. Harold C. Lenz, Dean of Students at Queens College, was summarily dismissed from his post. He was guilty of two "crimes": (1) He belonged to the Americans for Democratic Action and the American Civil Liberties Union. (2) In 1947 he defended the right of students to get a charter for any organization they wished to form. This brought him under the fire of the American Legion and the Catholic War Veterans.

Eisenhower "Balances" the Budget

In his 1952 presidential campaign, Eisenhower pledged to balance the budget, stabilize the dollar, halt inflation, cut taxes, etc. A few weeks ago a ballyhoo began in Washington about Eisenhower's alleged drastic cuts of the proposed Truman budget, accompanied by intimations that while there would be a deficit for 1953-54, it would be "slight," not more than a billion or so; and that next year, the budget would be balanced for sure.

Eisenhower still continues to claim that he is leading this country back to financial solvency. He continues to pretend that \$81/2 billion have been cut from the original Truman proposals. "This prodigious sum means more than \$50 for every man, woman and child in our country," Eisenhower boasted on May 19. "This is the first step in cutting expenditures." In the same breath, Eisenhower demanded that tax cuts "wait."

Nowhere in his speech did he mention that his projected budget for 1953-54 will top \$74 billion, an amount more than eight times as big as the "prodigious sum" of \$81/2 billion he falsely says he has saved for "every man, woman and child in the country." Nowhere did he explain that continued expenditures on this scale involve a deficit of a whopping \$6.6 billion on the basis of existing tax laws.

The Negro Struggle -What Kind of FEPC?

By Jean Blake

Advocates of Fair Employment Practices laws should study carefully the experience in the Ohio House of Representatives last week to see just how degenerated such legislation can become.

When the reactionary legislature got through amending the Burton bill, a weak, ineffective measure at the outset, it was made clear that the only "reforms" that will be passed today are those which are first transformed into weapons for the anti-labor witch hunters.

As passed by the House, the FEP bill makes it unlawful for employers, labor organizations, employment agencies or others subject to its provisions to publish any notice or advertisement relating to employment or membership which contains any specification or limitation as to race, religious creed, color, age, national origin or ancestry; or to require such information of any applicant for employment or membership.

The age provision, tacked on in an amendment, was opposed in vain by the author of the bill, who pointed out:

"We have no precedent for this. The amendment raises an entirely new problem. Including age means if a person applies for a job, the employer can't ask him how old he is. It raises the whole question of pension programs,"

The proponent of the amendment demagogically contended that since the bill aimed to eliminate job discrimination, "it is impossible for us to overlook any group."

But when Mrs. Anna F. O'Neil of Akron attempted to include an amendment barring discrimination against women, that logic didn't apply. The amendment was defeated.

Another amendment that did succeed,

however, was one specifically permitting employers to discriminate for political views. It provides:

Thus the net effect of this caricature of an FEP law would be to strengthen the witch hunt without weakening the ability of discriminatory employers to continue their contemptible practices one iota.

Notes from the News

NEGRO FAMILY EVICTED by force after New York City Marshall led a wrecking crew to batter down the door to the apartment of Mr. and Mrs. Sophie Decatur at the huge Bronx housing development of the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company. Some 50 neighbors of the Decators had barricaded themselves inside the apartment to resist the eviction. The previous day Mrs. Decatur and a group of her neighbors had staged a nine-hour sitdown strike by chaining themselves to the chairs in the office of the Metropolitan Life Insurance housing office. A demonstration of over 400 persons cheered Mrs. Decatur as she was led from the building by the cops. The Decatur family had subleased the apartment from the previous tenants.

BRAIN WASHING by Army Brass of injured American prisoners recently released in Korea failed to deter Col. Jimmy Pinkston of Jacksonville, N. C., from telling the truth. In an interview with the press Cpl. Pinkston declared that "most of the stories about Communists mistreating American prisoners are not true." He insisted that his captors did "everything possible to make our life pleasant."

EDITOR OF THE NATIONAL GUARDIAN, weekly newspaper which speaks for the Progress sive Party, is being held for deportation on Ellis Island following his appearance before witch hunter McCarthy's Senate Investigating committee.
