## A Student of Mein Kampf

During his first day on the witness stand, McCarthy quoted from Hitler's Mein Kampf at least three times. This does not come as a surprise to us. Long before McCarthy revealed publicly his study of Hitler's book, it was clear from his words and deeds that he was a close student of the man who thought up Germany's gas chambers.

Even some of McCarthy's favorite expressions and cliches are lifted right out of Mein Kampf. McCarthy's "20 years of treason" is the American fascist adaptation of Hitler's "14 years of shame and treason." One of Mc-Carthy's pet propaganda tricks is to recite the military and diplomatic defeats of America, turn to the Democrats or Republicans and ask: "Was this due to criminal incompetence or freason?" Hitler repeats again and again in Mein Kampf, in relation to Germany's defeat in World War I, "Was this idiocy or treason?"

But it isn't solely the similarity in expressions that demonstrates the parallel between Hitler and McCarthy. The Wisconsin Senator reminds us of Hitler because he is organizing in America what Hitler organized in Germany - a fascist movement.

McCarthy like Hitler starts with an appeal to the disoriented middle class. He has like Hitler concentrated on the "Communist menace" until the hysteria over the bogey has reached epidemic proportions. Like Hitler he

## What Would They Do Today?

"Finds No Way to Get Off of This 'Blacklist." That is the title of an editorial in the June 12 issue of Labor, official newspaper of the railroad unions, against the greatest blacklist the world has yet seen, the blacklist being daily compiled by agencies of the U.S. Government.

Labor cites the case of a young doctor, reported by Congressman Yates (Dem. Ill.), who joined an organization in 1948 that was cited three years later by the House Committee on Un-American Activities as "subversive."

The doctor was not an officer of the organization. He had nothing to do with its policy. He attended none of its business meetings. The first he knew that it had been blacklisted as "subversive" was when his application was rejected by the Army.

Naturally the doctor wanted to get off that blacklist. First he tried to get a hearing from the

Army. They refused.

Then the doctor went to his Congressman for help. Yates brought his weight to bear. But the FBI told him they "cannot clear people." Next Yates tried the House Un-American Activities Committee. They told him they "cannot clear people."

Labor expresses its alarm over the situation. "Not so many years ago, railroads maintained a 'blacklist.' When a worker was put on that

The Detroit Methodist Conference annual meeting, attended by 800 ministers and lavmen, unanimously adopted an anti-McCarthy report on June 11 that stated:

"McCarthy and his like-minded co-workers, including Congressman Kit Clardy of Michigan, have assumed the position of divinely appointed guardians of men's consciences, patriotism, thoughts. As such they destroy the judicial principles of trial by jury, legal council for the defendant and the right to crossexamine one's accusers.'

However, the authors of the report, who correctly liken McCarthy to Hitler, find it necessary to pound the drums about their anticommunism, as do all the liberal, Democratic and Republican anti-McCarthyites. They thus unwittingly accept the main premise of Mc-Carthy's witch-hunting formula today and of Hitler's before him.

In doing this the Methodist leaders fall into a double confusion. First, they indiscriminately couple Lenin, the founder and leader of the workers' movement of genuine revolutionary socialism in Russia, with Stalin, the destroyer of that movement. They fuse these two opposing figures, calling their creation "Lenin-Stalin." Second, they throw the would-be American Hitler into the same pot with this "Lenin-Stalin."

This reveals a failure to understand that the Hitler type heads a capitalist state, a state that cannot be equated with a workers state whether it is a healthy one as under Lenin or a very sick one as under Stalin.

### 'Surface Compliance'

Sen. Eastland and Rep. John Bell Williams, both of Mississippi, have introduced resolu-, tions in the Senate and House asking Congress to approve a constitutional amendment which, if ratified by the states, would destroy the Supreme Court's jurisdiction in matters of racial segregation.

This is one means by which the white supremacists are working to prevent any substantial change in the Jim Crow pattern in public schools and other fields. But it is not the most important means because there is not much likelihood of Congress adopting such a constitutional amendment this year; politically, it would not be wise or expedient.

Far more dangerous was the meeting of 15 Southern governors or their representatives in Richmond, Va., on June 10. The conference was held behind closed doors. "No one had any. thought of doing anything wrong," said Gov. Stanley of Virginia, the authorized spokesman for the participants, who included Byrnes of South Carolina and Talmadge of Georgia.

In their eyes there is nothing "wrong" in trying to circumvent the Supreme Court's decision against public school segregation. They are admirers of the Supreme Court when it rules their way and believers in the Constitution when it is interpreted their way; otherwise, they don't hesitate for a minute to disregard both the Court and the Constitution.

Representatives of three border states -Kentucky, Maryland and West Virginia - announced that they would not challenge the Supreme Court school decision because it was

not "as serious a problem" in their states as in others.

A Wife's 79-Hour Week By Joyce Cowley

Working wives have been blamed for just about everything from inadequate breakfasts to world unrest. Because they themselves realize it's almost impossible to handle two jobs, they sometimes feel confused and a little guilty. Or as Dean Helen G. Canoyer of the Cornell College of Home Economics puts it:

"The position of women today is potentially explosive. Often women who work are troubled and anxious about the homes they must also manage. Many women feel they must make an unbearable choice and some are unhappy whichever role they choose."

Just why is the choice "unbearable"? I've noticed that Deans of colleges, in spite of their education, don't seem to come to the point. But a survey made for General Electric by the Ross Federal Research Corp. gives you a better idea of why it's difficult for a wife to decide whether or not she should work.

The work-week of the average job-holding wife totals 79 hours, 40 hours in the plant or office and 39 at home. According to this report she can't expect a great deal of help from her husband or other members of the family. Working wives do spend less time shopping and cooking than full-time housewives, but this is mainly because they become more systematic. The working wife is not merely troubled and anxious. About twothirds of the women covered by this survey said they were "exhausted" or "quite tired."

MAKE LIKE A TOP. If you are within four miles of the point of an atomic blast there isn't much hope of avoiding serious eye injury, according to a digest of a Society for the Prevention of Blindness report which appears in the June 8 Labor's Daily. Based on Hiroshima and laboratory studies, the report says "any protective step such as eyelid closing ... covering by hands or instruments takes time." The peak of radiation is reached in less than one ten thousandth of a second - "long before any protective step helps." The major damage done by the bomb, they report, is burns from the heat which almost reaches that of the sun. They advise spinning like a top to dilute the incoming radiation. \* \* :

MINORITIES NEED TO RESTATE THEIR GOALS, says an editorial in the June 4 Los Angeles Tribune, a Negro weekly.
