With this issue of the RIP-SAW another year is closed. It has been in some respects the most trying year in our experience. The industrial depression, already acute when the European war began, was intensified during the months following hostilities, and literally millions of workers were out of work, many of them verging on actual starvation. The business conditions of the country were in a correspondingly demoralized state, as a result of which the advertising patronage upon which even socialist publications are compelled to rely to some extent, was practically destroyed, thus reducing our already limited resources to a point where expense exceeded income and for several months the drain and strain continued as if to test to the last fibre the fitness of the RIP-SAW to pass through the ordeal of fire and serve the revolutionary movement in any possible exigency that might confront it.

But never for one moment was there any doubt as to the RIP-SAW'S survival or lack of faith as to the ultimate outcome. All socialist papers and publications, depending so largely upon the workers, and these impoverished to the last degree in these hard times, were subjected to the same trial and we are glad to note that nearly all of them weathered the storm.

During the last few weeks there has been a revival in certain lines of industry, mainly those manufacturing arms and munitions of war, and a large number of the unemployed having thus found employment, there has been a consequent period of "better times." How long this may last the wisest among men may not know.

It is after all a rather melancholy prosperity which has its foundations in brutal warfare and in the ruthless slaughter of humanity.

But such is capitalism and whether we will or not we are in it and of it and until we are able to conquer and overthrow it we must submit with such grace as we have at command to its cruel and criminal consequences.

It is not for the RIP-SAW to sound the note of despair at the close of the old year, but rather to welcome with hope and cheer the new year now dawning upon the world. It is in our power, if we so will it, to make the new year at our threshhold one luminous with brave endeavor and high achievement. Let us be animated as never before with the militant spirit and clasp hands and pull together for the good of all.

Let us reorganize the International upon a solid foundation of Internationalism." Let us put forth our best efforts to industrially organize the workers and unite them politically in the Socialist party. THE FRAUD OF "PREPAREDNESS"

in the public mind. "Preparedness" in the sense in which the master class understand it simply means that the American republic, like the monarchies of Europe, is to become a military despotism.

Of course this is not the interpretation of "preparedness" given to the public by the organs of capitalism and militarism. The billion dollar fund the champions of "preparedness" are conspiring to have congress create for their benefit is to be used in building up a great standing army and a powerful navy to insure the peace and tranquility of the country.

Was there ever such an admixture of idiocy and crime?

And yet there are millions who are foolish enough, even in the light of the conflagration and devastation of Europe, to imagine that when we are armed like a highwayman we shall not be one, but that on the contrary we shall pass for a gentleman and no one will dream of molesting us.

The most gigantic fraud ever perpetrated upon gullible American "patriots" is the fraud of master class "preparedness." There has always been in this country a hostile public sentiment to a large standing army and now, in this world crisis, when Europe is burning to ashes, the American ruling class, in the light of the awful conflagration, are deliberately plotting to foist the standing army, for which they have been secretly conspiring these many years, upon the American people.

Every working man and woman and every sympathizer with the common people; every lover of liberty and every enemy of oppression and injustice should cry out in protest against this fraud and crime in the cloak of "preparedness" and "patriotism."

If the peace of the world can only be maintained by a race of armed murderers then the race should perish from the face of the earth for it is not fit to survive.

But it is a lie, a ghastly, infamous lie hatched by the American plutocracy to blind and stupefy the American people while their once boasted republic is surreptitiously converted into a military oligarchy and the last vestige of freedom has been destroyed.

The RIP-SAW predicts the liveliest socialist campaign in 1916 ever witnessed in this country and is getting its arsenal in shape for action on the firing line.

Every second of our time, every particle of our energy, and every penny of our resources are required in the every-day struggle of the workers to emancipate themselves from the power of capitalism and militarism that is crushing out their manhood and destroying their

The supreme weakness in the American movement is the lack of revolutionary industrial and political organization. Until the workers are organized and have learned how to co-operate under their own self-discipline, the capitalists will rule and the workers will continue to be their slaves.

PATRIOTISM AND PAUPERISM

There is not a land on earth with more "patriotism" to the square inch than the United States of America, nor a land of equal development and opportunity in which so many of the "patriots" are gravitating towards pauperism. If we have any doubt as to this latter tendency we have but to study the figures in the report of the federal board of industrial relations which indicate unerringly the ugly fact that one third of the American wage-earners are in a poverty-stricken condition, that two-thirds of the male workers are paid less than fifteen dollars per week, that half the wage-earn- ingly must we persevere in our task. If at times it seems as if our ing fathers receive less than fifty dollars per month, that half the efforts were all in vain it is just then that we must triumph over

women wage-workers receive less than a dollar a day, and that on⁶ The term "preparedness" has come to signify a monstrous thing out of every twelve persons who die in New York City, the great American metropolis, is buried as a pauper in the pottersfield.

We thus see that "patriotism" and "pauperism" have a common

tendency and flourish side by side.

Does it not strike a man with a bit of sense that the kind of "patriotism" that winds up in "pauperism" is bogus and fraudulent, and that it merits scorn and contempt instead of praise and adulation among honest men?

There is a true patriotism but it is not limited by geographical boundaries nor is it inculcated in the minds of the people by the bureaucracies, the aristocracies and plutocracies that now rule the world. The patriotism they teach is the false and vicious patriotism that ravages and plunders, that riots in blood and glories in the massacre of mankind.

We socialists, scorned as we are by the exploiters, looters and oppressors of the people, we too are patriots, but our patriotism embraces the earth and expresses itself, not in murderous armament, in asphyxsiating bombs and liquid gases, but in kindness, good will, and loving service to our fellow men.

The cause of woman suffrage achieved a notable victory in the recent elections in New York, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania and New Jersey, where the suffrage amendment was submitted to a popular vote. While the amendment was defeated in all of these states, as was to have been expected, nearly a million votes (or over 40 per cent of the total) were cast for it, assuring victory in the not distant future.

It is not often that the RIP-SAW ventures to give advice, but it feels constrained to advise the war lords, the jingoists, the munition manufacturers and their whole brood of degenerate retainers in the press, the pulpit and elsewhere to go a bit slow, lest in their haste to transform this vaunted republic into a military despotism they precipitate a revolution that will shake them from their pedestals and send them headlong where Lucifer long ago blazed the way.

POVERTY-STRICKEN WORKERS

One third of all the wage earners in the United States, accord-It may be necessary to split hairs, but it is not in our line. ing to the federal commission on industrial relations, are in a povertystricken condition. The fact is of stupendous importance to the working class.

> What can be said in defense of a system in which every third working man is the miserable victim of a poverty-stricken life, especially in a land rich beyond dreams and with machinery enough to produce abundantly for every man, woman and child?

> How can any working man give his vote in support of a system that robs him of the fruit of his labor and reduces him to a beggar?

> And yet the melancholy spectacle confronts us of these very poverty-stricken victims of capitalism lining up with an eagerness that is tragic and almost heart-breaking with the capitalist parties which uphold the system which starves their bodies and destroys their souls. But we may not yield to despair on that account. All the greater is the need to reach these benighted victims of capitalism and open their eyes to the fact that they are the blind instrumentalities of their own slavery and degradation.

> The light of socialism, once it penetrates these minds so long in darkness, will work wonders in the way of inspiring these workers to strive with all their might for emancipation instead of being the

wretched victims of their own blind and cruel fate.

Everlastingly must our appeal be made to them and everlast-

ourselves and prove ourselves unconquerable in our revolutionary

propaganda.

To educate and rightly educate the toiling and enslaved masses is indeed a stupendous undertaking and for that very reason appeals to men and women who are strong and brave and self-reliant, high-minded and noble-souled, and though they may utterly fail in their day, their lives attest their fidelity to their ideals and the generations that follow sing anthems of praise to their consecrated lives.

The RIP-SAW stands four-square for the industrial organization of the workers on a revolutionary basis, for the Socialist party, for equal suffrage, and for war against war and for the overthrow of the system that breeds war, enslaves labor, degrades womanhood, robs childhood, and brutalizes all humanity.

It is the pet phrase of the glib-mouthed kaiser and the strutting aristocracy who regard themselves as anointed from on high and as immeasurably above the common herd; it is they, the lordly parasites, the blue-blooded leeches who mouth this insinuating phrase when they want the miserable serfs they hold in scorn to go out to slaughter to extend their domain and pile up their spoils.

The ruling classes of the nations in Europe who have let loose the destructive furies of hell itself to sate their satanic greed for power and pelf have the gall, amidst these scenes of indescribable horror, to tell their miserable dupes that they are fighting like fiends and dying as dogs would not die for the honor and glory of "their dear fatherland.'

What insulting irony to these misguided slaves of their sordid,

soulless masters!

The land that is called the "Fatherland" is the land owned by the kaisers, czars, kings lords, princes, aristocrats and plutocrats, and if wholesale murder must be committed to save the land let the leeches and parasites who own it go out and murder one another and annihilate themselves from the face of the earth. They will not be missed.

The state of Texas contains 170.000,000 acres. Of this vast empire 117,000,000 acres have been gobbled up and are held out of use by landlords and other land sharks. A great majority of the actual farmers are either mortgaged or have been reduced to tenants, renters, and feudal serfs. It is high time for these impoverished farmers to cut loose from the political party of the landlords and cast their lot with the Socialist party, the only party that stands for the socialization of land, the implements of social productions, and the emancipation of the tillers of the soil and the industrial workers.

TRIUMPH FOR EQUAL SUFFRAGE .

There are those who imagine that because the equal suffrage amendment submitted to the voters of New York, New Jersey, Massachusetts and Pennsylvania in the recent elections failed to receive a majority of votes, the cause of equal suffrage sustained an irretrievable defeat. Nothing could be farther from the truth. On the contrary, when the circumstances under which this first political battle for suffrage in the eastern states was fought is taken into account it is obvious at a glance that a splendid triumph was achieved.

First of all, it should be borne in mind that all the forces of reaction and all the powers of corruption were marshalled against the women. Not a political boss nor a ward-heeling politician but was in commission to defeat the amendment.

Never was the old saying that "politics make strange bedfellows" better exemplified. Cardinal Manning, in the name of ASSASSINS!

the holy church, was in political alliance with booze and boodle and with the blear-eyed deformities of capitalist misrule to prevent women from having a share in the control of government and in the administration of public affairs. Yet in spite of all these powerful interests and their unclean mouthpieces almost a million votes were cast for equal suffrage in the four states named, as follows:

Pennsylvania	577,100	260,577	316,523	45.0

These figures are certainly well calculated to give cheer to the women and men who stand for equal suffrage and inspire them with hope and strength for the future. The first battle was bravely fought and the result exceeded all reasonable expectations. Never was there greater enthusiasm or braver determination displayed in any political conflict. The women fairly earned the right to their place on the political battlefield and henceforth they will hold it and renew the battle again and again until the stain of sex despotism is wiped from our escutcheon and women celebrate their political emancipation.

Fear paralyzes the moral energy and destroys all noble aspiration. Be brave, live up to your best and all wholesome influences will combine "in spite of the world, the flesh and the devil" to help you work out your destiny.

ELIJAH LOVEJOY'S PRESS UNEARTHED

From Alton, Illinois, comes the announcement in a press dispatch that "the main part of the press of Elijah P. Lovejoy, antislavery editor, which was wrecked by a mob 78 years ago, was found by workmen who are excavating for a new building."

It was in 1837 that Lovejoy was murdered by a pro-slavery mob and his press for the second time thrown into the Mississippi river. It was his speech of protest against this foul murder of Lovejoy that gave Wendell Phillips, then a young man, his national fame.

The relic of the old press uncovered at Alton should be treasured as of priceless value. It is the reminder of a historic incident that once disgraced the city that is now proud to claim the dust of the first martyr to the abolition of chattel slavery.

When Lovejoy was mobbed nearly four score years ago he was denounced as a "black abolitionist," "free lover," "nigger lover" etc. He was murdered in cold blood and the crime was applauded by every slave owner and every apologist and retainer in their service.

Today a great monument marks the spot where Lovejoy sleeps, while the mob that murdered him is in oblivion or remembered only with execration.

The leaders of the present abolition movement, infinitely greater than that in which Lovejoy perished, may well profit by his heroic example.

The war in Europe is murdering its millions and devastating the earth, but the ruling aristocrats who are responsible for it are still with us. Their patriotism never fails and never will as long as they have hordes of benighted subjects to hurl themselves headlong into the jaws of hell at the crook of their finger.

PRIVATE ARMIES OF GUNMEN


One of the most infamous and brutal features of modern capitalism is the private army of gunmen now in the service of great corporations, such as the Standard Oil company, the Pennsylvania Railway company, the Calumet and Hecla Mining company, etc., etc.

In strikes or threatened disturbances the private army of hired assassins, recruited from slums and sewers and dives in the redlight, plays its part in cold blood from the start. These assassins, for the price of a bottle of whisky, would brain a pregnant woman or roast a babe in its crib.

> Poverty Causes Pellagra Dread Scourage of South, U. S. Health Service Finds

WASHINGTON, Nov. 14.—While professional "uplifters," philanthropists and investigators have given various reasons for the Southern scourge known as pellagra, the United States Public Health Service declares that its investigations during the past year have proven that pellagra is caused by workers being too poor to buy proper foods, and that "the availlack of anything obscene or vic-ious was found most striking. In financial ability of the Southern wageearners' families to provide a properly balanced diet."

An exhaustive review of data relating to the diet of workingmen's families, particularly among the poorer classes, who suffer most from pellagra. has been made by the service in connection with its study of the disease. This tends to show that the rise in the cost of food bears directly upon the increased prevalence of pellagra, as it makes it harder for the poorer families to obtain a general diet of healthful foods.

"The fower the economic status of the white America family," says the review, "the greater is the pressure for sacrifices in diet, particularly in animal protein foods, since they are the most expensive.

"The economic status of wage-earners' families in the Southern States, particularly of cotton and mill families. is lower than that of wage-earners' families in other sections of the country.

The final epoch-making experiment of the Public Health Service was carried out at the farm of the Mississippi State penitentiary about eight miles east of Jackson, Miss., and together with the previous work of the service completes the chain in the prevention WOULD and cure of the disease. JACKSON, Miss., Nov. 14.—Gov-ernor Brewer has pardoned the eleven convicts who volunteered to be experimented on by officials of the United States Public Health Service, and who proved that poor diet is responsible for pellagra. Six of the convicts were life prisoners. The experiments extended over a period of one vear. It is stated that six of the pardoned men have pellagra in a pronounced form, and they will now be nursed back to health.

In the homes of 37 per cent of American workingmen three or more persons sleep in a bedroom.

Thirty-seven per cent of the wives of American workingmen are compelled to engage in work outside of their household duties to enable the family to live.

Half of the wage earners who are supporting families receive not more and many less than \$10 a week.

Twenty per cent of the school children of the working class are underfed.

Babies of working class mothers do not have half the chance of living as the babies of mothers whose economic condition enables them to provide The ratio properly for their care. of deaths is three to one.

Who is it that is imperiling the family and "breaking up the home?"

A kind Eastern philosopher voluntarily hands out the information that "if eight out of every ten of the unemployed had saved 20 per cent of their wages they could get along in this crisis." To which we add: If these unemployed and starving workers had not been robbed out of 80 per cent of the wealth they produced by idle parasites, there is not the least doubt but that they could get along, and mighty well, too.

"WASHINGTON, - September 27.—Wireless telephone communication across the continent was accomplished for the first time today, when experiments extending over several months culminated in successful transmission of the human voice by radio from the great naval plant at Arlington, Va., across the continent to the station at Mare Island, Cal., 2500 miles away.'

From time to time annoucements are made of what has been done along lines of foreign policy. 





shocked and stunned with the collapse of the International at the outbreak of the European That the International war. DID collapse, and utterly so, when the crucial test came, it were folly any longer to deny or attempt to extenuate. fact, humiliating though it be, confronts us and honesty with ourselves and with the world demands that we frankly acknowledge it.

The International went to pieces as a confederation of NATION-ALS in the very hour it should have demonstrated its power as an INTERNATIONAL. In a word, when the crisis came, nationalism, patriotism and militarism, the essential components ing to note that the first steps of capitalism, triumphed over internationalism and in a twinkling its vaunted solidarity vanished and our international movement was torn into fragments and these fragments marshalled in battle array by their common enemy, and from that day to this "comrades" have slaughtered "comrades" with the ferocity of fiends on a thousand ensanguined battlefields.

It is admitted that up to the time the war was declared the socialists in the several countries involved, without an exception, did all it was mortally possible for them to do to stay the hand slaughter and prevent the outbreak of hostilities; but when, in spite of their warning and protest, the dogs of destruction were let loose—in the very hour they should have stood their ground and vindicated the principles of the International at whatever cost—they wavered and broke under the national pressure and were swept into the red gulf of hell where the multiplied thousands of the betrayed victims have been perishing ever since.

But it is not to pass judgment upon the past that I now write, but for the purpose of profiting by the calamitous experience of our comrades in Europe and preparing for the future. The day may be nearer than we imagine when we, here in the United States, will have to prove ourselves and the fitness of our movement to survive the onslaught of the murderous military hordes of capitalism.

It is urged by many that we can do but little, if anything, until the war is over, with the result that matters are allowed to drift, and the weakening and demoralizing effect of this policy is becoming more and more apparent with the passing days.

To insist that nothing can be done until the war is over is to confess that the war has paralyzed the socialist movement even here,

Socialists the world over were of hostilities, and we are certainly to the service of the ruling class. The not only keenly disappointed, but anything but socialists if we are inclined to make any such base and cowardly confession.

> The truth is that something CAN be done, something vital and far-reaching in its influence if we are possessed of the militant spirit which is the very life of our movement and without which it is dead as a mummy, though its adherents number legions. Now is the very time for the socialists in neutral countries, especially here in the United States, to take the lead in re-affirming the principles of internationalism and preparing the way for the reorganization of the International upon a basis that will make it impregnable to future assaults.

sultry love story of a young English nob, but the simple tale of the easy and leisurely life of a socialist agitator. I left St. Louis on October 12 with two things on my mind; First, I wanted to visit as many of the Eastern municipalities as I could reach and see what was being done or had been done in dealing with the problem of unemployment, and second, share in the work of the Socialist Suffrage Campaign Committee of New York City.

I visited a number of municipalities and will visit a great many more during the winter and hope that my investigation will be useful when fin-

I reached New York Saturday evening and Theresa Malkiel, the greatest human dynamo extant, met me at the Ferry and sent me back to the wilds of Jersey to talk Suffrage to the Jersey Cityites which I did while the great crowd waited for Debs to arrive. Sunday I spoke with Congressman Meyer London and Gene Debs in the great Carnegie Hall meeting in New York. Right here I want to remark that this meeting was one of the biggest, best managed affairs I have ever attended and I have seen some meetings in my life. The Socialist Suffrage Campaign Committee (a group of New York Socialist women led by Theresa Malkiel as organizer) had charge and the meeting was arranged for, handled and officered entirely by the women. . Every seat was sold and the "Standing-room Only" sign put out twenty minutes before the opening time. One hundred young girls dressed in white and wearing great red "Votes for Women" sashes acted as ushers and I have never seen a great crowd handled as efficiently. Meta Stern made an ideal chairman, Meyer London was at his best, Gene charmed his hearers as he always does and I attempted to sustain the reputation of the West in general and my sex in particular to the best of my ability. When the Carnegie Hall meeting was glorious history then the fun began and I had a chance to find out what real, downright hard work meant. I spoke from three to five times every day in every manner of place where human beings gather in masses.

One Hundred Meetings in One Day. New York city was the vortex of the great Suffrage cyclone that was sweeping over the conservative, mossbacked, rock-ribbed East, and the Socialist Suffrage Campaign Committee seemed to be the dyanamic center For the first time in the storm. the life of New York the women were IT and the male was only a background for female activities. New York was OURS and every man and woman wanted to hear what we had to say on Suffrage, and we said it—indeed we did. From soapboxes and carttails, autos and trucks, piles of lumber and stacks of brick we hammered home the economic need of Equal Suffrage and always there were just as many people to listen as our voices could reach. I am sure the work done by the Socialist Suffrage Campaign Committee breaks all records and there is no doubt but Theresa Malkiel and her loyal helpers have set a pace that will be hard to equal.

In one day we distributed sixty thousand English leaflets, fifty thousand Jewish; sold twenty-five hundred one-cent books, fifteen hundred fivecent books, put up forty thousand stickers, held one hundred meetings and collected money enough on the street corners to pay the cost of the day's work. The Campaign Committee Side High School Building. started without a cent in the treasury,

Don't be shocked, this is not the MEN ANYWHERE ON EARTH dtry love story of a young English EQUAL THAT RECORD?

Suffrage did not carry in New York, but no one ever dreamed that it would. Great revolutionary changes are not made in one campaign, but are won by long years of constant work and education. The vote was far greater than the most hopeful anticipated and the new campaign is now on and will be continued until the male Henry Dubb is really educated. The Campaign of the Socialist Party of New York was just as wonderful and inspiring as the Suffrage campaign, in fact they were one. I never knew whether it was the Socialist Party of the Suffrage Campaign Committee I was speaking for and which ever it was I talked the same kind of Socialism I talk in Oklahoma and the people ate it up in just the same way. On the lower East Side I was speaking at a nice, dignified suffrage meeting in a schoolhouse and a bunch of young comrades rushed in and kidnapped me and demanded that I go out on the street and take a democratic politician's crowd away from him which I did in just three minutes and we held five thousand people for two hours in a nasty drizzling rain. McKinley Square Casino in the Bronx Debs was the principal speaker. At eight o'clock the great hall, seating about four thousand was filled, and the smaller hall seating fifteen hundred packed. The police closed the doors and four thousand people were in the streets. U. Soloman with only three speakers: Debs, London and myself managed to keep all the meetings going and get a collection of \$100 over and above ticket sales.

Elected Socialist Legislator.

In the Brownsville District in Brooklyn I spoke to two monster meetings in one evening and thereby helped share the joy of helping to send Shiplicoff, the first Socialist Assemblyman,

From New York I went to Philadelphia to speak for the Socialist Literary Society in the Broad Street Theatre. Here I found just the type of work that is so sorely needed in every city and it is quite possible if we would use good common, horse sense in the management of our propaganda meetings. The Socialist Literary Society is furnishing the working class just what they are hungry for, music, culture, social life, artistic expression, and all founded on the bedrock of Socialism. To speak in the Broad Street Theatre is a joy and to see the work being done there is an inspiration. How I wish other cities would do the same splendid Adv. Debate in Dubuque.


From Philadelphia I made the long jump over to Dubuque, Iowa, where two college boys from a Catholic college felt equal to the task of "smashing Socialism." The Dubuque Comrades brought me over to champion the cause against the onslaughts of the sophomores. The largest hall in town was packed to the doors and every one had their money's worth in uproarious fun; incidentally two very nice young men know now that they can't "smash Socialism" with the weapons furnished by their college textbooks, while the local has taken on new life and added sundry bits of filthy lucre to the treasury.

I am just aching to get at the doughty Peter.

Fine Meeting at Centerville. My last meeting was at Centerville, Ia., a typical county seat town, in a rich Iowa county. It was a splendid example of what one good live Socialist can do if he has the right stuff in him. There is no local at Centerville, but Comrade Willes, a coal miner, handled a Debs meeting there last summer which packed the largest hall. Encouraged by this Comrade Willes tackled another meeting for me, filled the largest meeting place, was forced to turn people away who could not squeeze in. 

Votes for Women Urged by Shaw, as Cavell Memorial

Writer Opposes "Dishonoring Moses' Memory" by a "Display of Claptrap."

By International News Service.

LONDON, November 6.—In a little over a fortnight nearly \$40,000 has been subscribed to newspaper funds for the erection of national memorials to Miss Edith Cavell. It is proposed to place a statue of the nurse near Trafalgar Square, and also to erect a home

George Bernard Shaw, however, discussing the project, suggests a much

more lasting memorial, as follows:
"As what Nurse Cavell did and suffered was done for us, it is right and natural she should be a heroine to us and it would be disgraceful of us to dishonor her memory by a cinemetagraphic display of clap-trap or merely to break her coffin into stocks to beat the Germans with.

"There is a way in which we can pay our duty to her and test the sincerity of her loudest champions.

"We cannot complain of the denial to her by military law of all the safeguards of human justice, because we have shot ten people ourselves without any of those safeguards under the same law. We cannot plead her sex, because our own criminal law, civil and military, makes no distinction between men and women, and no woman asks it any more than Nurse Cavell did.

"We cannot vapor about chivalry, because if she had come back alive to demand the political rights granted to the meanest of men and had broken a shop window to compel attention to her claim, she would have been mobbed and insulted and subjected to gross physical violence, with the full approval of many of the writers who are now canonizing her.

"What we can do is very simple. We can enfranchise her sex in recognization of her proof of its valor. A bill might gracefully be introduced by Mr. McKenna in Commons and Viscount Gladstone in the House of Lords.
