KENTUCKY MINERS ARE RALLYING TO THE COMMUNIST PARTY

#### MANY WORKERS RALLY TO TAKE SIMMS' PLACE

Workers from the blood-soaked mining towns of Kentucky are rallying to the Communist Party and the Young Communist League to take the place of Comrade Harry Simms, 19-year-old Communist strike lead-er and member of the National Executive Committee of the Young Com-munist League who was murdered by Arvin Miller, Brush Creek gun thug, three weeks ago.

#### See Way to Victory

Hundreds of miners realize now the tremendous part that must be played in every strike by the van-guard of the working class, the Communist Party. They know that if the Party had been built before the strike, and had been strengthened during the strike, the fight would have been many times more effective from the beginning. In actual practice the most advanced of the striking miners are rapidly learning how Party units work in the mines, how the Party fraction must work as the motive force in the strike committees, in the handling and distribution of relicf, in defense, and in all the manifold activities connected with a fight against the starvation and terror program of the bosses.

#### Northern Workers Join

Memorial meetings and demonstrations for the martyred youth who sacrificed his life in the Kentucky miners' fight have been held throughout the whole country. A big advance in the collection of food, clothing and money for the Kentucky-Tennessee strikers is noted since the death of Comrade Simms.

One of the many attempts at whitewashing Roosevelt was the ousting of the New York county sheriff, Thomas M. Farley, from office on charges of corruption in connection with a bank account that far exceeded his salary. Tammany can well afford to sacrifice a sheriff if it can thereby ene the chances of one of its minions, whose whole political career was nurtured in the Tammany cesspool of vice and graft.

Cordell Hull, reechoing the Morgan press, assures "the South" that Roosevelt has proved by the removal of Farley that he is not subservient to any political machine, "no matter how powerful" and that he shows "the quality this country expects its presidents to have." Such talk is mere deception. What quality does Hull refer to? The quality so ably displayed the thieving Harding and his Teapot dome cabinet whose luminaries re Hoover, Coolidge, Mellon, Daugherty, Fall, Hughes and Denby? Or were Hoover, Counting, meaning as its figurehead—a gang of Wall Street the present cabinet, with Hoover as its figurehead—a gang of Wall Street buzzards that have inflicted mass starvation upon the workers and farmers of the country, while spending billions in war preparations carried out to the accompaniment of the most unscrupulous duplicity, the filthiest warmongering intrigues ever known, not even excepting the hypocrisy of Woodrow Wilson about "making the world safe for democracy?"

If it is such qualities that Hull refers to we certainly cannot with him when he says that Roosevelt is a fit successor to either Wilson, with him when he says that Roosevelt is a ht successor to either wilson, Harding, Coolidge or Hoover. He is eminently fitted by inclination and training to take the place of any one of them as figurehead of the despotic, murderous, strike breaking hunger government of Wall Street. It is also fitting that Cordell Hull, leading Southern political shyster of the Demonstration of the Demonstration of the Corden with the strike th Party, a party that aids the Southern ruling class maintain itself in power through systematic lynch terror, a Party that is at this moment try-ing to burn alive eight innocent Scottsboro boys as part of the campaign of terror against Negro and white workers and farmers, a Party that has as one of its other presidential aspirants the lynch governor, Ritchie, of Maryland, should sing the praises of Tammany Roosevelt.
