Baron von Speck-Sternberg was born in Leeds, England, in 1852. He was the son of Baron Alexander and Martha (Shaw) von Speck-Sternburg. He was educated in Germany, fought through the Pranco-German war in the Second Saxon Drageous and was in active military service till 1885. In that year he was appointed and was in active military service till 1885. In that year he was appointed military attache to the German legation at Washington, reappointed in 1889 and transferred as major to the German general staff. He joined the diplomatic service in 1890, served in Peking and Beigrade, and in 1896 was appointed first secretary to the German Embassy at Washington. In 1900 he was Consular General of Germany for British India and Coston and appointed Minister Ptentpotentiary and Envoy Extraordinary to Washington on special mission. 
