PRIMARY ELECTIONS TO-MORROW

Tuesday, September 8, will be the official Primary Election Day, and every enrolled Socialist voter is urged to vote the ticket nominated by the party organization. The polis will be from 3 to 9 p. m. The list of Socialist party polling places will be printed in The Call on Tuesday, so that voters may not go to the wrong polling place.

The enrolled voter may vote at the primary if he has resided in the same election district in which he is en-rolled for at least thirty days before the day of primary election. The voter will receive from the in

spectors, unfolded, one Socialist party ballot printed on pink paper; he will prepare his ballot and return it folded. to the election inspector, who must deposit the ballot in the box of the cialist party

If told by the election inspector that there are no Socialist party pri ist Headquarters (3586 75th). A voter may bring his own ballot and deposit same and the election inspector must accept it. The ballot, however, must be printed on the same paper and be in every respect similar to the official primary ballot as prepared by the Socialist party.




