The great question of Labor – its condi-tions, its relations to capital and skill, the physical, intellectual, and accial evil suffored by those who perform it, its nave a prominent one before the people. It is seen that the present long hour system of monotomous toil is destinctive to health and flips, that it gives the labbrer no time for mendal culture, or for the development of his social nature, and the enjoyments of hour as set to toiling millions, and destroying their self-respect and indepen-tion of the self to the self sector of the short hour system.
